A BILL

For an ordinance making appropriations from the State Conservation Trust Fund contingency and the Capital Improvements Fund contingency.

WHEREAS, additional funds totaling \$185,000 and \$1,500,000 are required for existing and new projects supported by the State Conservation Trust Fund and the Capital Improvements Fund, respectively; and

WHEREAS, said capital projects meet the criteria for using contingency in that they complete projects where there is an unanticipated serious health and/or safety hazard; project conditions such as laws, regulations, or standards have changed, requiring additional project elements; or bids were extraordinarily high and the scope of work cannot be reduced;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

Section 1. Expenditures are hereby authorized from the State Conservation Trust Fund, Accounting No. 35000, the amounts of money in the following tabulation to be expended for the purposes and upon the authorizations in said Ordinance set forth:

The foregoing appropriations will provide additional funding for the First Creek Park project, which is being implemented in partnership with the Urban Drainage and Flood Control District, and will provide additional funding for construction and/or land acquisition at the Platte Farm Open Space in Globeville.

Section 2. Expenditures are hereby authorized from the Capital Improvements Fund, Accounting No. 31000, the amounts of money in the following tabulation to be expended for the purposes and upon the authorizations in said Ordinance set forth:

4 demolition of the old Union Pacific Railroad Yard Office near 35th Street and Wynkoop Street to
5 complete the 38th and Blake Area Transit-Oriented Development (TOD) project; and future property
6 planning and evaluation efforts.

7 **Section 3.** The Chief Financial Officer of the City and County of Denver is hereby authorized
8 and directed to make such book and record entries and to do such other things as may be necessary
9 to accomplish the purposes of this Ordinance.
