VISITORS PLEASE NOTE

Use of our parks is for all citizens. We ask your cooperation in maintaining park facilities by obeying the following:

- Use trash cans for litter.
- Be courteous to others. Refrain from playing stereo loudly.
- It is prohibited to have a stereo audible 25 feet from a vehicle.
- Please keep charcoal grills 12" above the grass.
- No grilling or skateboarding in parks. (Skateboards are allowed on trails.)
- Absolutely no feeding or otherwise disturbing wildlife.
- To reserve a site for group functions or volunteer opportunities call Denver Parks and Recreation Permit Office, 720-413-6700.

Chapter 39 of the Denver Municipal Code provides that:

- Drugs, smoking and glass bottles or containers are prohibited.
- Animals must be on a leash (except in designated off-leash sites).
- The removal of and damage to plants is prohibited.
- Consumption of alcoholic liquor is prohibited (permits required for Special Occasion Permit Sites or Festival Permit Sites).
- Overnight camping or tents is prohibited.
- The sale of goods and services is prohibited except by permit.
- Motorized vehicles except in designated roads and parking areas are prohibited.

Violators are subject to Police action and fines.
