Proposed Amended Contract Terms

November 20, 2009 – December 31, 2013 in the amount of \$562,000.00 increase of \$400,000.00 We are requesting this amendment due to the increase and demand of Adult Softball Programs throughout the City and County of Denver. When we original put this service out for an RFP, Softball In Denver was the only vendor to submit a proposal. We are extremely satisfied with the services provided by the vendor.

Please note all Citywide Sports programs are at least 150% cost recovery. The intent of the special revenue fund is to expand programs and help subsidize youth sports programs. It also assists with maintenance costs. Currently I employee one FTE through the special revenue fund as a result of the 2009 layoffs and 20 on-call employees.
