Marybeth,

First and foremost, thank you for your personal support in regards to the recent break-ins and car vandalism in our Hilltop neighborhood. Also, thank you for Officer Burkhardt's contact information. He and I have talked on the phone, and I also sent him some additional information by email. Events in our alley last weekend bring this issue very close to home.

The recent and continuing problem with urban crime in this neighborhood is concerning. Previously this was not part of the culture or community in this part of our fair city. It is now. Adding high density rental housing will only add to this recent deterioration.

We moved to Hilltop several years ago. A large part of why we moved here from Aurora was the lower crime rate, quality of life, the triangle of parks (Cranmer, Robinson and Crestmoor), and the surrounding Hilltop neighborhood, and South Hilltop where we live.

Since we arrived, Cherry Creek has been unfortunately transformed into a concrete canyon. That high density development has already changed our shopping and dining patterns. We do not go to Cherry Creek as often. Then, to our east, numerous developments including the Promenade, and the Buckley Annex will contribute additional density problems with their inevitable impact on traffic, noise, crime and safety.

I do not think that is the message Denver wants to project to current and future residents.

To level set: I am not against development. We all live in structures that were developed at some time in the past. I do however take exception to the extreme density being built out in this area. Adding yet another high density, and in this case the highest density development

<u>ever</u> in this neighborhood is not a good idea. Allowing a move from less than 3 units per acre to over 52 units per acre is not responsible to the city or its residents in my opinion.

The developer's needs and aspirations aside, once they are done they owe nothing to the neighborhood. They will however have extracted their profits. They will be long gone once the problems begin, or in the case of crime, escalate. The impact of density on crime is well documented. I am sure Officer Burkhardt can provide his insights on this topic.
