made available from the \$1,305,864 that was previously unallocated as well as \$1,175,921 in interest earnings that accrued through August of 2023. These allocations, combined with the redirection of funds within the ARPA Recovery category, support \$2 million in funding for the Denver Basic Income Project and \$23.4M for the House 1000 initiative.

This bill request seeks to reallocate \$1,500,000 from the Administration to the Recovery category. These dollars had been allocated in the Administration category to fund ARPA program evaluations. Given the significant investment of one-time ARPA dollars in the All in Mile High Initiative and the recurring costs the City will spend with local dollars to continue AIMH beyond the life of ARPA, the City wishes to evaluate this program. Since the evaluation will extend beyond the spending period of ARPA, the City wishes to fund it through the Department of Housing Stability's Special Revenue Fund (the Homelessness Resolution SRF), and repurpose the ARPA dollars initially planned for the evaluation to fund immediate All in Mile High program needs.

This bill request also seeks to amend Ordinance No. 591, Series of 2021, as amended by the subsequent ordinances, to allocate \$2,000,000 in the "Recovery" category from interest earnings accrued through February 2024. This allocation will support the All In Mile High Initiative.

If approved, and if the pending companion ordinance to the Long Bill is approved, the total allocations in the ARPA Grant will be as follows:

- \$77,707,270 in the "Revenue Loss" category
- \$2,457,300 in the "Administration" category*
- \$230,687,021 in the "Recovery" category**
- \$8,230,500 in the "Premium Pay" category
- \$0 in the "Unallocated" category
