BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

- **Section 1.** Upon consideration of the recommendation of the Executive Director of Public Works that an ordinance be enacted for the purpose of assessing the annual costs of the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance and replacement of the St. Luke's Pedestrian Mall, for the upcoming year, upon the real property, exclusive of improvements thereon, benefited the Council finds, as follows:
- (a) A local maintenance district providing for the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance and replacement of the St. Luke's Pedestrian Mall, was created by Ordinance No. 878, Series of 2000;
- (b) The annual cost of the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance and replacement of the St. Luke's Pedestrian Mall is \$61,000.00, which amount the Executive Director of Public Works has the authority to expend for the purposes stated herein;
- The Executive Director of Public Works has complied with all provisions of law relating to the publishing of notice to the owners of real properties to be assessed and to all persons interested generally, and the Council sitting as a Board of Equalization has heard and determined all written complaints and objections, if any, filed with the Executive Director of Public Works:
- The real property within the St. Luke's Pedestrian Mall will be benefited in an amount equal to or in excess of the amount to be assessed against said property because of the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance and replacement of said Pedestrian Mall.
- The annual costs of the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance and replacement of the St. Luke's Pedestrian Mall to be assessed against the real properties, exclusive of improvements thereon, benefited are hereby approved.
- 33 **Section 3.** A portion of the annual costs of the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance 34 and replacement of the St. Luke's Pedestrian Mall in the amount of \$61,000.00 is hereby assessed

1 against the real properties, exclusive of improvements thereon, within said local maintenance

2 district as follows:

NOTE: Whenever a series of lots is mentioned it shall be understood to include the first, intermediate and last named lots, and the amount appearing after such series shall be the assessment for each lot in the series. Where a series of lots is followed by "inclusive" the amount appearing after the series shall be the total for all lots in the series.
