2. **Title:** Amends a contract with Goodwill of Colorado to add \$1,261,497.00 for new total of \$2,368,074.00 and add one year for a new end date of 6-30-2026 to continue providing case management and supplemental services to Colorado Works (CW)/ Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) participants to enhance employability and economic well-being, citywide (SOCSV-202473266/SOCSV-202580420-01).

5. General description or background of proposed request. Attach executive summary if more space needed:

- DHS is responsible for administration of the Colorado Works (CW) program, also known as Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), in the City and County of Denver pursuant to Colorado Revised Statutes (CRS) at section 24-4-103 (11) CRS, and Colorado Code of Regulations (CCR), 9-CCR-2503-6. Funding for the TANF program is provided by the United States Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) and administered in the State of Colorado by the Colorado Department of Human Services (CDHS).

Outside of determining eligibility and issuing benefit assistance to participants, other administration responsibilities include promoting the long-term economic well-being of the community, through preparation for and attachment to employment for those who are able to work. DHS' CW/TANF Program is designed to engage individual participants with the services, opportunities, resources, and tools needed to successfully move toward stability and self-sufficiency. DHS facilitates robust community gains by partnering with local businesses, educational institutions, and other service providers in the area, and advocating for participants as a vital part of the DHS support network. For those who are not readily able to work, DHS' CW/TANF program offers supports and services intended to increase employability and promote family safety and stability.

- Goodwill of Colorado was competitively awarded a contract in 2024 for an original term of 07/01/2024-06/30/2025 and initial contract amount of \$1,106,577 to provide services consistent with the above stated CW/TANF Program goals. This amendment will extend the contract duration by one year for a new end date of 06/30/2026 and add \$1,261,497 for a new total amount of \$2,368,074. Through this contract amendment, Goodwill of Colorado will continue to employ a combination of supplementary measures and case management strategies to help CW/TANF participants/families enhance employability and economic well-being.

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Goodwill of Colorado is further identified as a subrecipient for the purposes of this contract and is therefore subject to all terms, conditions and regulatory requirement required of federal funding subrecipients per 2 CFR Part 200, as well as specific rules and regulations for CW/TANF.

3. DHS and its higher authority, CDHS, have been working diligently to interpret and gauge the potential impact of the changes made at the Federal level to ensure the allocation passing through CO State to Denver County is sufficient for benefit issuance as well as providing support services. While DHS is confident that the current allocation can afford to extend the service contracts, the collaborative work needed for budgeting and planning have slightly delayed the contract extension/amendment process.

Scope of work:

Goodwill shall provide case management and supplemental services to TANF participant categories: Service Lane 1 & Service Lane 2.

Case Management Services include: Case management, participant assessment, creation/maintenance of individualized plans/roadmaps, entry/maintenance of case files within Colorado Benefits Management System (CBMS), support to find alternative paths to income other than traditional employment, reduction of barriers to employment such as learning disabilities or substance abuse, referrals for other supplemental services, benefit extension assistance, supervisory case file reviews, and other case management duties as assigned by CO State and DHS.

Supplemental Services

Participants in Service Lane 1

- Inputs: subsidized employment opportunities, work-building and career pathway-oriented learning experiences, upskilling credential opportunities such as Vocational Education Trainings that align with participants' long-term career paths and enable participants to gain credentials in sought-after fields.
- Activities: Motivational interviewing, career assessments, resume construction, and job search assistance.

Participants in Service Lane 2

- Inputs: Job skills and readiness development, life/employment skills class curriculum for education and soft skills, partnerships with local employers and employment specialists.
- Activities: Education Classes/General Educational Development (GED), Soft Skills Development, Professionalism workshops, job readiness workshops, resume development, mock interviews, and basic Microsoft Office training.
