AMENDATORY AGREEMENT

This **AMENDATORY AGREEMENT** is made between the **CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER**, a municipal corporation of the State of Colorado (the "City") and **RE:VISION**, a Colorado nonprofit corporation, whose address is 3800 Morrison Road, Denver, Colorado 80219 (the "Consultant"), ("the Parties").

RECITALS:

- **A.** The Parties entered into an Agreement dated September 14, 2023, (the "Agreement") to perform, and complete all of the services and produce all the deliverables set forth on Exhibit A, Scope of Work, to the City's satisfaction.
- **B.** The Parties wish to amend the Agreement to update paragraph 18-notices, add paragraph 34-Compliance with Denver Wage Laws, and update the budget exhibit.
- 1. Section 18 of the Agreement entitled "**NOTICES:**" is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with:
- "18. NOTICES: All notices required by the terms of the Agreement must be hand delivered, sent by overnight courier service, mailed by certified mail, return receipt requested, or mailed via United States mail, postage prepaid, if to Consultant at the address first above written, and if to the City at:

Executive Director of Public Health and Environment or Designee 201 W. Colfax Avenue, Suite 800 Denver, Colorado 80202

With a copy of any such notice to:

Denver City Attorney's Office 1437 Bannock St., Room 353 Denver, Colorado 80202

Notices hand delivered or sent by overnight courier are effective upon delivery. Notices sent by certified mail are effective upon receipt. Notices sent by mail are effective upon deposit with the U.S. Postal Service. The Parties may designate substitute addresses where or persons to whom notices are to be mailed or delivered. However, these substitutions will not become effective until actual receipt of written notification."

- 2. Section 34 of the Agreement entitled "<u>COMPLIANCE WITH DENVER WAGE</u> <u>LAWS</u>:" is hereby added to the Agreement as follows:
- applicable to the Consultant's provision of Services hereunder, the Consultant shall comply with, and agrees to be bound by, all rules, regulations, requirements, conditions, and City determinations regarding the City's Minimum Wage and Civil Wage Theft Ordinances, Sections 58-1 through 58-26 D.R.M.C., including, but not limited to, the requirement that every covered worker shall be paid all earned wages under applicable state, federal, and city law in accordance with the foregoing D.R.M.C. Sections. By executing this Agreement, the Consultant expressly acknowledges that the Consultant is aware of the requirements of the City's Minimum Wage and Civil Wage Theft Ordinances and that any failure by the Consultant, or any other individual or entity acting subject to this Agreement, to strictly comply with the foregoing D.R.M.C. Sections shall result in the penalties and other remedies authorized therein."
- 3. All references in the original Agreement to **Exhibit B, Budget** now refer to **Exhibit B and B-1, Budget. Exhibit B-1** is attached and incorporated by reference herein.
- 4. As herein amended, the Agreement is affirmed and ratified in each and every particular.
- 5. This Amendatory Agreement will not be effective or binding on the City until it has been fully executed by all required signatories of the City and County of Denver, and if required by Charter, approved by the City Council.
