

Committee Consent Agenda

Business Development

- BR16- Approves a loan agreement with the Denver Housing Authority (DHA) for \$620,000 in HOME funds (HUD) structured as a performance loan to provide construction and permanent financing on a 45-unit senior/disabled affordable rental housing project known as Mariposa VII located at 1040 Osage Street in Council District 3.
- RR16- Amends a contract with B2GNow/Ask Reply, Inc. to add \$57,750 for a new total of \$1,122,362 to the total contract amount to add and maintain functionality to the current system to better track payments to subcontractors (CE61401).

Finance & Services

BR16- Authorizes the purchase of two (2) composting trucks for \$500,000 and two (2) bike lane maintenance trucks for \$100,000 for the Department of Public Works through the Planned Fleet Replacement Fund.

Infrastructure & Culture

BR16- Vacates a strip of Quebec Street at 4955 Quebec Street in Council 0059 District 4.

Governance & Charter Review

- RR16- Approves the Mayoral appointment of Kristina Bad Hand and Kimberly Varilek to the Denver American Indian Commission for terms effective immediately and expiring 7-11-17, or until successors are duly appointed.
- RR16- Approves the Mayoral reappointments of Milroy Alexander, Rachel Neumann, Ann Torgerson; and, the appointment of Steven Hutt to the Lowry Redevelopment Authority Board of Directors for terms effective

immediately and expiring 8-31-18, or until successors are duly appointed.

Safety & Well-being

- RR16- Amends a contract with the Mental Health Center of Denver to add an additional \$830,000 for a new total amount of \$2.49 million to provide housing and treatment services for 75 chronically homeless individuals with co-occurring serious mental illness and substance use disorders (SOCSV-2013-14438-03).
- RR16- Amends a contract with the Volunteers of America to add an additional \$120,000 for a new total amount of \$520,786.50, to provide up to 10 beds per night for Denver's homeless Veteran women population, including women with children, to achieve the goals of improved residential stability, increased income, and self-determination through the Home Again program (SOCSV-2013-09649-03).
- RR16- Amends a contract with Pinyon Environmental, Inc. by adding \$480,000 0065 for a new total amount of \$960,000 and extending the term by two years for a new end date of 04-26-18 for on-call environmental site consulting services (ENVHL-201520873).
- RR16- Amends a contract with Catholic Charities and Community Services, Inc. to add an additional \$707,745, for a new total amount of \$957,745 to provide emergency shelter services for up to 70 women per night (SOCSV-2015-22551-01).

Routine, non-controversial requests for ordinances that are not substantive policy changes may be placed on Consent Agendas for Council Committees each week with the approval of Committee chairs. Councilmembers receive the consent agendas for review and have until Thursday at noon to request that an item be scheduled for Committee discussion.
