A BILL

For an ordinance amending the Denver Retail Marijuana Code, Chapter 6, Article V, of the Denver Revised Municipal Code to allow the Denver Department of Excise and Licenses to hold an open application process for new licenses in the year 2021.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

Section 1. Article V of Chapter 6 shall be amended by adding the language underlined and deleting the language stricken to read as follows:

ARTICLE V. – Denver Retail Marijuana Code

Sec. 6-203. – City-wide cap on certain retail marijuana licenses; annual open application process.

(c) Beginning in ~~2017~~2021 and continuing once in each calendar year thereafter, the director shall administer an open application process for new retail store licenses and new retail marijuana cultivation facility licenses, to the extent the total number of then-current licensed locations in either category in the city falls below the cap on marijuana sales locations and the cap on marijuana cultivation locations respectively, and only if the cumulative number of then-current licensed locations for any combination of marijuana cultivation or sales licenses falls below the cumulative cap on marijuana cultivation and sales locations. The annual open application process shall be subject to the following requirements:
