Executive Summary Bluebird BID Creation Ordinance

Business improvements districts are organized for the benefit of commercial properties to assist with infrastructure improvements and maintenance, as well as having the ability to perform marketing and economic development activities.

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The estimated 2013 budget of the BID is anticipated to be approximately \$50,000. The BID's 2014 budget is expected to be funded primarily through the an ad valorem property tax mill levy of up to fifteen (15) mills applied against the assessed value of the taxable commercial property within the BID. Residential and agricultural property will not be subject to the BID's mill levy.

The Board of Directors of the District (the "Board") shall consist of seven (7) electors of the District, appointed by the City in accordance with Section 31-25-1209(1)(b), C.R.S. The initial members of the Board are proposed as follows: Don Novak, Tom Secrist, Sean Mandel, Tyler Carlson, Master Sung Hwan "Tiger" Kim, Richard "Buzz" Geller, and Drew Gottleib. All Board members are business or property owners within the BID.
