Guilty by Reason of Insanity), transitioned to the community, are removed voluntarily, or are removed due to rule infractions. Allowing participants to remain in the treatment program throughout the court process, while also remaining in the facility in the district of their criminal case, is in line with best practices of competency restoration. This practice allows for minimal disruptions and facility transfers, keeps most participants closer to their public defenders, family and significant others, and minimizes the chances for decompensation after a competency finding. All parties recognize the CDHS supports such practices yet will not have influence over one's placement within the jail once restored to competency or otherwise discharged from restoration treatment. Prioritization of restoration beds within that milieu will be for those in need of initial admission.
