28	Amend Section 2.6.1 by adding the language under	lined, to read as follows:

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1 Amend section 2.6.3. by deleting the language stricken and adding the language underlined 2 to read as follows:

3 § 2.6.3 Special police Ordinance enforcement by persons other than police 4 officers.

5 The Manager of Safety may, at the Manager's sole discretion, appoint, subject to the supervision of the Mayor, such special police officers and patrol 6 7 officers, with or without pay from the City, as necessary, all of whom shall be subject 8 to the orders of the Chief of Police and shall be authorized and empowered to do and perform such of the duties of the members of the police force not inconsistent 9 10 with this Charter and the ordinances of the City as may be specified by the said Chief of Police. commission persons other than police officers to enforce specific 11 ordinances of the City for specific periods of time, with or without pay from the City. 12 13 To the extent such persons are employees of the City, they shall perform any and all 14 assigned enforcement duties under the supervision of their appointing authority. To the extent such persons are authorized volunteers of the City, they shall perform any 15 all assigned enforcement duties under the supervision of the department or agency 16 17 for which the person is providing volunteer services. Such persons shall not be considered members of the classified service, shall not be considered peace officers 18 19 within the meaning of state law, nor shall they have the power to effect arrests as 20 peace officers under state law.

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Amend section 2.6.4 by deleting the language stricken and adding the language underlined to read as follows:

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§ 2.6.4 Sheriff Department.

25 The Sheriff Department, which shall perform the duties delegated by the Manager of Safety, shall be composed of the Sheriff, who shall be appointed by the 26 Mayor; Deputy Sheriff Division Chiefs and Deputy Sheriff Majors, all of whom shall 27 28 be appointed by the Sheriff with the approval of the Manager of Safety; and Deputy Sheriffs Deputy Sheriff Division Chiefs, Deputy Sheriff Majors and other employees, 29 30 as may be necessary to perform the duties of the department, who all of whom shall 31 be appointed by the Manager of Safety pursuant to Career Service requirements. 32 and the Undersheriff, who shall be appointed by the Mayor and shall hold such position so long as his or her services are satisfactory to the Mayor. The salary, 33 34 benefits and other compensation of the Sheriff, Deputy Sheriff Division Chiefs, 35 Deputy Sheriff Majors and the Undersheriff shall be established by ordinance. The 36 Sheriff shall exercise the powers and perform the duties now required or that may 37 hereafter be required by the Constitution or the general laws of the State to be 38 exercised and performed by the county sheriff; provided, however, the Sheriff and 39 other employees of the Sheriff Department shall perform law enforcement duties 40 assigned by state law to county sheriffs only to the extent authorized by the Manager of Safety; and provided further that the Manager of Safety shall be deemed the 41

1	appointing authority pursuant to Career Service requirements for purposes of hiring,
2	discipline and termination of deputy sheriffs and other employees within the Sheriff
3	department.

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5 Amend Section 2.6.6 by deleting the language stricken, to read as follows:

6 § 2.6.6 Fire Department.

The Fire Department shall be composed of the Chief of the Fire Department,
who shall be appointed by the Mayor from the rank of Assistant Chief of the
Classified Service of the Denver Fire Department, and such other subordinates
appointed pursuant to Civil Service requirements and employees appointed pursuant
to Career Service requirements, as may be necessary to protect the City and County
against fire and to provide other emergency services as designated by the Manager
of Safety.

Amend subsection 9.1.1 (C) and (E)(vi) by deleting the language stricken and adding the language underlined, to read as follows:

16 § 9.1.1 Career Service personnel system.

17 (C) The City Council shall by ordinance enact a classification and pay plan and attendant pay rates for all classifications in the Career Service and all classifications 18 not in the Career Service except elected and appointed Charter officers, the ranks of 19 20 the classified service in the Police and Fire Departments, Deputy Sheriffs, Deputy Sheriff Majors, Deputy Sheriff Division Chiefs, and the Undersheriff Sheriff, based 21 22 upon the duties of the several classifications. The pay rates as reflected in the pay 23 plan shall provide like pay for like work within such classifications. The Council shall also by ordinance enact benefits for employees in such classifications. The Council 24 25 shall enact such ordinances after recommendations are made as provided in 26 subsection (D) of this section. Nothing in this section shall be deemed to prohibit the payment of incentives for outstanding performance by employees within such 27 classifications according to standards and procedures established by ordinance. 28

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(E) The Career Service shall comprise all employees of the City and their positions except:

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(vi.) members of the Classified Service of the Police and Fire Departments, the
 Police Chief if not a member of the Classified Service, the Fire Chief if not a member
 of the Classified Service, and the Undersheriff Sheriff;

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Amend subsection (E)(i) of section 9.3.11 by adding the language underlined, to read as follows:

§ 9.3.11 Eligible registers, for original appointment and promotional appointment; requisition and certification.

- 5 (E) *Original appointment.* The Commission shall establish rules to provide for the 6 requisition by the Manager of Safety, and the certification to the Manager of Safety, 7 of applicants for original appointment.
- 9 (i) Appointment of certified peace officer with a minimum of three years patrol 10 experience or firefighter with a minimum of three years full-time firefighting 11 experience. An applicant to the Classified Service of the Denver Police Department who is currently certified as a peace officer and who has a minimum of three years of 12 13 patrol experience as a law enforcement officer may receive original appointment in 14 the Police Department upon meeting all qualification and examination standards 15 established by the Commission and the Department of Safety, upon being certified to 16 the Manager of Safety, and upon receiving written approval of the Chief of the Police 17 Department and the Manager of Safety. An applicant to the Classified Service of the 18 Denver Fire Department who has a minimum of three years of full-time firefighting 19 experience may receive original appointment in the Fire Department upon meeting 20 all qualification and examination standards established by the Commission and the 21 Department of Safety, upon being certified to the Manager of Safety, and upon receiving written approval of the Chief of the Fire Department and the Manager of 22 23 Safety.
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Amend subsection 9.3.18 (B) by deleting language stricken, to read as follows:

26 § 9.3.18 Public safety cadet program.

(B) Time spent in the public safety cadet program shall not be considered as time in
 the Classified Service, if the public safety cadet is subsequently appointed to a
 position in the Classified Service. The Manager of Safety shall appoint no more than
 twenty five percent cadets from the cadet eligible register of the total of any academy
 class selected for original appointment in the Classified Service.

- Amend section 9.5.1 by deleting the language stricken and adding the language underlined, to read as follows:

§ 9.5.1 Chief of the Fire Department appointed by Mayor; reversion to prior rank upon removal.

1 The Chief of the Fire Department shall either be appointed from within or from 2 outside the Classified Service of the Denver Fire Department by the Mayor from the 3 rank of Assistant Chief of the Classified Service of the Denver Fire Department and 4 shall hold such position so long as his or her services are satisfactory to the Mayor. In the event that the appointment is made from within the Classified Service of the 5 6 Denver Fire Department and the Mayor removes such appointee, he or she shall 7 revert to the rank of Assistant Chief his or her previous rank, unless he or she is 8 eligible for retirement when so removed, in which event he or she shall be entitled to 9 retire as Chief of the Fire Department. The salary, fringe benefits, and other 10 compensation of this position shall be established by ordinance.

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Amend Section 9.5.2 by deleting the language stricken and adding the languageunderlined, to read as follows:

14 § 9.5.2 Deputy Chief and Division Chiefs.

15 The Chief of the Fire Department may from time to time, with the approval of 16 the Manager of Safety, assign not more than one (1) member members of the Classified Service of the Denver Fire Department of the rank of Assistant Chief to 17 18 perform the duties of Deputy Chief and not more than six (6) members of the 19 Classified Service of the Denver Fire Department of the rank of Assistant Chief to 20 perform the duties of Division Chief, each of whom shall perform such duties so long 21 as his or her services are satisfactory to the Chief and the latter shall see fit to 22 continue such assignment. The total number of command assignments permitted by 23 this section at any one time shall not exceed seven (7). The pay rates and fringe benefits for those members assigned the duties of Deputy Chief or Division Chief 24 shall be established by ordinance. The Chief of the Fire Department shall appoint the 25 26 a Deputy Chief or, if the a Deputy Chief is unavailable, a Division Chief to serve as 27 Acting Chief in the Chief's temporary absence.

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Amend Section 9.5.5 by deleting the language stricken in subsection (B) and adding a new subsection (C) to read as follows:

31 § 9.5.5 Rank and grade upon original appointment and thereafter.

B. Applicants who are employed pursuant to a duly approved intergovernmental agreement, as provided in § 9.3.11(E.)(iii), may be appointed to any rank in the Denver Fire Department but not higher than the rank of Firefighter 1st Grade.

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36 C. Applicants who are employed under the terms of Section 9.3.11(E)(i) shall be
 37 appointed to Firefighter 4th Grade until such time as that member has successfully
 38 completed the Fire Academy, at which time the Manager of Safety, at his or her

13	If the member serves as a Firefighter 3rd grade or a Firefighter 2nd grade, the			
14	member shall serve a full year at such grade before advancement to the next grade.			
15	The member retained or appointed to a grade as described herein shall have no right			
16 17	to seek review of that decision before the Civil Service Commission, Chief of the Fire			
17	Department, or the Manager of Safety. Appointments made pursuant to this Section shall be considered original appointments and shall require completion of a full nine			
18 19	month probationary period after having successfully completed the Fire Academy.

22	Amend section 9.6.1 by deleting the language stricken and adding the language			
23	underlined to read as follows:			
24	§ 9.6.1 Chief of Police appointed by Mayor.			
25	The Chief of Police shall either be appointed from within or from outside the			
26	Classified Service by the Mayor and shall hold such position or employment so long			
27	as his or her services are satisfactory to the Mayor, or shall be hired from outside of			
28	the Classified Service by the Mayor pursuant to a contract.			

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Amend section 9.6.3 by deleting the language stricken and adding the language underlined,
 to read as follows:

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§ 9.6.3 Deputy Chief, Division Chief, and Commander.

The Chief of Police may from time to time, with approval of the Manager of Safety, assign not more than two (2) Police Officers in the Classified Service of the Police Department of the rank of Captain of Police <u>or Lieutenant of Police</u> to perform the duties of Deputy Chief of Police, who shall perform such duties so long as his or her services are satisfactory to the Chief of Police and the latter shall see fit to continue such assignment. Deputy Chiefs shall perform any and all duties assigned

1 by the Chief of Police and, if there are two Deputy Chiefs the Chief of Police has 2 assigned more than one Deputy Chief, one Deputy Chief shall be assigned by the 3 Chief of Police to act as Chief of Police whenever the Chief of Police is unable to act 4 because of absence or incapacity. The Chief of Police may from time to time, with 5 the approval of the Manager of Safety, assign not more than five (5) Police Officers 6 in the Classified Service of the Police Department of the rank of Captain of Police or 7 Lieutenant of Police to perform the duties of Division Chiefs of Police, each of whom 8 shall perform such duties so long as his or her services are satisfactory to the Chief 9 of Police and the latter shall see fit to continue such assignment. In no event shall 10 there be more than six Deputy Chiefs or Division Chiefs in total at any one time. The 11 Chief of Police may from time to time, with the approval of the Manager of Safety, 12 assign not more than twelve (12) Police Officers in the Classified Service of the Police Department of the rank of Captain of Police or Lieutenant of Police to perform 13 14 the duties of Commander of Police, each of whom shall perform such duties so long 15 as his or her services are satisfactory to the Chief of Police and the latter shall see fit 16 to continue such assignment. When filling Commander positions making 17 assignments under this section, the Chief shall make all reasonable efforts to do so in a way that will not result in a net increase in the ongoing complement of command 18 19 staff (including the ranks of Lieutenants and Captains) or a net decrease in the 20 ongoing complement of line positions. The total number of command assignments 21 permitted by this section at any one time shall not exceed eighteen (18).

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Amend section 9.6.4 by deleting the language stricken, to read as follows:

§ 9.6.4 Salary and benefits of Chief, Deputy Chief, Division Chief, and
 Commander.

Salaries and fringe benefits for the Chief if a member of the Classified
 Service, Deputy Chiefs, Division Chiefs, and Commanders of Police shall be
 established by ordinance. Salary and fringe benefits for the Chief if hired outside of
 the Classified Service pursuant to a contract shall be approved by ordinance.

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- Amend subsection 9.9.2 (A) by deleting the language stricken and adding the language underlined, to read as follows:
- 33 § 9.9.2 Definitions.
- As used in this Section, the following terms shall, unless the context requires a different interpretation, have the following meanings:

1 The term "Deputy Sheriff" shall mean all members sworn by the Manager of (A) 2 Safety in the Sheriff Department of the City and County of Denver, except the 3 Undersheriff Sheriff, Deputy Sheriff Division Chiefs, and Deputy Sheriff Majors. 4 5 6 Section 2. The voting machines and paper ballot for said election shall carry the following 7 designation, which shall be the title and submission clause: 8 9 10 11 REFERRED QUESTION 12 13 Shall the Charter of the City and County of Denver be amended concerning the 14 management of the public safety departments of the city by creating and empowering the office of Sheriff and assigning to the Sheriff the powers and duties assigned by 15 general law to county sheriffs, eliminating the title of "special police," eliminating the 16 17 requirement that the Chief of the Fire Department must be appointed from within the Department, providing authority for lateral hiring of experienced firefighters in the Fire 18 19 Department in a manner similar to the way lateral hiring is currently allowed in the Police 20 Department, and allowing the Chief of the Fire Department and the Chief of the Police Department greater authority to assign command ranks within their respective command 21 22 staffs without increasing the overall size of their respective staffs? 23 24 25 Section 3. Each elector voting at the election and wishing to for or against the amendment 26 shall indicate the elector's choice by depressing the appropriate counter of the voting machine which indicates the word "YES" or the word "NO", or by appropriate marking upon paper ballots 27 28 when used.

Section 4. The proper officials of the City and County of Denver as are charged with duties relating to the election shall, before the election, issue such calls, make such certifications and publications, give such notices, make such appointments, and do all such other acts and things in connection with the submission of this Charter amendment to the registered electors of the City and County of Denver at the election as are required by the Constitution and laws of the State of Colorado and the Charter and ordinances of the City and County of Denver.

Section 5. The ballots cast at such election shall be canvassed and the results ascertained,
 determined, and certified in accordance with the requirements of the Constitution and laws of the
 State of Colorado and the Charter and ordinances of the City and County of Denver.

38 Section 6. If any section, paragraph, clause, or other portion of this ordinance is held to be
