## **Executive Summary**

This contract engages Denver Public Schools (DPS) as the City's youth provider of the Denver Youth Employment Program (DYEP) (which beginning in the 2023 calendar year, replaced the former Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP)). In building off the SYEP, the DYEP has the capacity to provide year-round services in addition to the traditional paid summer internship.

#### 2024 Contract Outcomes:

Enrollments: 309Work Experiences: 293

## 2025 Contract:

The program will serve 375 eligible Denver youth with the following outputs/outcomes:

- Total served 375
- Placement in paid summer work experience − 275
- Successful completion of summer work experience 198
- Placement in year-round programming 100
- 80% of Year-Round, including summer youth, will complete job readiness training

#### Additional outcomes to be tracked:

- Participants entering or returning to education
- Job readiness training enrollments
- Demographic information
- Income barrier information
- Participants who receive financial literacy

DPS will provide recruitment, assessment, program enrollment, job development, placement, job coaching, financial literacy, career exploration and other customized workforce development services for eligible Denver youth.

At a minimum, 275 eligible youth will be placed in a youth work experience, offering 110 hours (for Summer) or 75 hours (for the Fall or Spring semesters) of paid work experience at the current City minimum wage (, up to \$2,069.10 in wages). Eligible youth include Denver residents who are:

- Eligible to work in the United States between the ages of 14-21
- Be a resident of Denver or a student of a Denver School,
- Attending or registered for secondary or post-secondary education,
- And be a low-to-moderate income earner, with income at or below 300% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines for the size of the household, based on the most recently published poverty guidelines by the Department of Health and Human Services
