STATUS - 2 APPOINTMENTS:

The National Western Center Authority Board is made up of 11 voting directors and two non-voting directors. One of the non-voting directors is the City CFO who will serve as Treasurer. You appoint 7 of the 11 voting directors (all will need to be confirmed by City Council), and 1 of the non-voting directors. The non-voting director must be a GES resident as well as 1 of the 7 voting directors. CSU makes 2 appointments and WSSA makes 2 appointments. A voting director may not be an elected official or an officer or employee of the City.

NOTES:

The Chair and National Western Center Authority Board will provide oversight of the buildout, operations and programming of the year-round National Western Center campus for agricultural education, innovation and entertainment. You appoint the initial Chairperson, but following the completion of the initial campus development, the Chairperson will be elected by the Board. The Authority will be incorporated by the City and County of Denver as a Colorado nonprofit corporation to program, operate and maintain the campus. Joe Garcia and Jacque Hinman recently resigned. You are filling the two vacancies created by their resignations.

Lucía Guzmán

Lucía Guzmán is a Colorado state legislator who currently serves as the Minority Leader in the Colorado Senate. Appointed to the Colorado Senate in May 2010, Guzmán represents Senate District 34 in Denver. She was elected to full four-year terms in 2010 and 2014.

Political career[edit]

Guzmán is the former executive director of the <u>City and County of Denver</u>'s Agency for Human Rights and Community Partnerships, having been appointed by Mayor <u>John Hickenlooper</u> in 2003. She is a former member of the Denver Public Schools Board, serving from 1999 to 2007. An ordained minister, Guzmán was executive director of the Colorado Council of Churches from 1994 to 1999.

2010 appointment[edit]

Guzmán announced her candidacy to succeed the term-limited Paula Sandoval in the Colorado Senate in July 2009. She was the sole candidate to be placed on the primary ballot for the seat by the Democratic Party district assembly in April 2010, although state representative <u>Joel Judd</u> announced that he would try to make the primary ballot via the petition route. When Paula Sandoval was elected to Denver City Council in May 2010, Guzmán was the only candidate to run to fill the vacancy. A vacancy committee of precinct committee officers of the Democratic party elected her to fill the vacancy by acclamation. She took the oath of office on May 21, 2010.

2010 election[edit]

In the Democratic primary election held on August 10, 2010, Guzmán faced Judd for a four-year senate term and won with 62% of the vote. In the general election which took place on November 2, 2010, she easily outpaced her Republican opponent, taking 78% of the vote.

Personal life[edit]

Guzmán is a lesbian. She is one of eight openly <u>LGBT</u> current or former members of the <u>Colorado</u> <u>General Assembly</u>, including senators <u>Pat Steadman</u> (D–Denver) and <u>Jessie Ulibarri</u> (D–<u>Commerce City</u>), as well as representatives <u>Leslie Herod</u> (D–Denver), <u>Mark Ferrandino</u> (D–Denver), <u>Paul Rosenthal</u> (D–Denver), <u>Dominick Moreno</u> (D–Commerce City), <u>Joann Ginal</u> (D–<u>Fort Collins</u>) and <u>Sue Schafer</u> (D–<u>Wheat Ridge</u>).
