PURPOSE:	Appointment for the Mile-High RETAC

Purpose of Council:

The MHRETAC has the responsibility for creating a regional implementation plan for delivery of emergency medical and trauma care.

Appointment Process:

RETAC consists of three members, recommended by Denver Health, appointed by the Mayor and then confirmed by City Council for (2) two-year terms.
