

SCFD Foundations

- The SCFD was created in the late 1980s, when the Denver metro area faced economic downturn.
- The district was developed in direct response to drop-offs in attendance and revenue at Denver's top cultural institutions.
- The initial intention was to fund only Denver-based attractions but was ultimately expanded to surrounding counties.

HOW SCFD WORKS

For every **\$10 spent** in the metro Denver area, **one penny** of the sales tax goes directly to arts, culture and science organizations of all sizes with more than **300** organizations funded





Key Impacts





Public Support



- 1988 – Passed at 75% of the vote
- 1994 – Passed at 57% of the vote
- 2004 – Passed at 65.7% of the vote
- 2016 – Passed at 63% of the vote
- 2028 – Will be on ballot to reauthorize

Road to 2028 Reauthorization

Goals:

- Create an inclusive, transparent process for SCFD's stakeholders to facilitate equitable decision-making and outcomes
- Establish the foundation and structure for the next era of the SCFD that recognizes the profound evolution of society and the arts

Stakeholder Engagement Process (2026-2027)

1. Research and Landscape Analysis
2. District-Wide Listening Tour
3. Initial Proposal Development
4. Stakeholder Consensus Building
5. Final Proposal

Road to 2028 Reauthorization

Phase 1: Research & Landscape Analysis

- Onboarding
- Analysis of internal financial and structural data
- Informational interviews with community members
- Stakeholder mapping

Phase 2: District-Wide Listening Tour

- Listening tour (in person and virtual opportunities)
- Questionnaire for funded partners
- Formation of stakeholder advisory group
- Presentation on learnings

Road to 2028 Reauthorization

Phase 3: Initial Proposal Development

- Create menu of conceptual changes to statute
- Fiscal analysis and forecasting
- Proposal development and dissemination


Phase 4: Stakeholder Consensus Building

- Work sessions with Stakeholder Advisory Group
- Refine proposal and track consensus
- Legislative engagement

Phase 5: Final Proposal and Board Action

- Proposal finalization
- Board vote on proposal
- Legislative engagement
