## 6. General description of proposed ordinance including contract scope of work if applicable:

This ordinance request is to appropriate \$500,000 of Capital Improvement Funds (CIF) for the 38<sup>th</sup> and Blake TOD project. The 38<sup>th</sup> and Blake TOD project consists of various elements including the 35<sup>th</sup>/36<sup>th</sup> Pedestrian Bridge which includes the relocation of the Union Pacific (UPRR) Yard Office, 38<sup>th</sup>/Blake Bridge, sidewalks, and other infrastructure supporting improved connection to the 38<sup>th</sup> and Blake Station and the transportation system. Supplemental CIP funding is needed for the implementation of this project. This project meets the following justification for use of CIP contingency:

- Scope of work that cannot be reduced further or phased
- Unanticipated extraordinarily high bids as a result of the current construction market and associated escalation.
- Federal funding from RTD via an executed IGA which obligates that the City pedestrian bridge must be in place before the East Rail Line begins service in the spring of 2016.
- Project unable to be deferred until the next fiscal year as a result of a critical construction timeline and unanticipated conditions.

The timing of this appropriation request allows for continued coordination with Better Denver Bond and CIP improvements currently underway. With this appropriation, the 38<sup>th</sup> and Blake TOD project budget for the project elements currently underway will be as follows:

- \$3.23M Better Denver Bond Program for 38<sup>th</sup>/Blake Bridge and 35<sup>th</sup>/36<sup>th</sup> Pedestrian Bridge
- \$1.35M Federal funding via an IGA with RTD for completion of the 35<sup>th</sup>/36<sup>th</sup> Street Pedestrian Bridge
- \$4.44M Approved CIP appropriation for 35<sup>th</sup>/36<sup>th</sup> Pedestrian Bridge and relocation of UPRR Yard Office.
- <u>\$500,000</u> Proposed CIP appropriation for completion of the 35<sup>th</sup>/36<sup>th</sup> Street Pedestrian Bridge and relocation of UPRR Yard Office.

Total \$9.025M

In addition to the above, \$2.89M is appropriated for the completion of the 38<sup>th</sup>/Blake bridge and \$2.04M is appropriated for the supporting sidewalks. The total 38<sup>th</sup> and Blake TOD project budget is approximately \$14.4M.

The balance of the CIF 2015 contingency after this \$500,000 appropriation will be approximately \$1,100,000.
