Program Strategies Targeted to the Characteristics Common to Female Ex-offenders: To meet the needs of juvenile female ex-offenders and ex-offenders with characteristics common to females, the DTYA program will provide intensive, culturally and gender-sensitive Case Management services, a self-efficacy program delivered by trainers from an Alternative Pregnancy center that are highly skilled in working with young women's unique set of needs, and a suite of female-focused training programs that address healthy relationships and sexuality, violence prevention and economic literacy. In addition Case Managers will connect participants with critical services: childcare and child support enforcement, affordable housing, federal medical and food aid programs, and legal services

Target population: The program will serve 250 youth from services provided to any incarcerated youth within 90 days of release and youth who are on probation or in a diversion program in Denver.

Proposed Outcomes: The DTYA program aims to align with the performance goals outlined by the Employment and Training Administration for this program and will measure this by tracking: 1) The number of participants placed in employment, post-secondary institutions and occupational skills training; 2) The number of participants retained in employment and education placements after program completion; 3) The recidivism rate for program participants as compared to that of ex-offenders who do not receive services; 4) The number of participants who receive high school diplomas and GEDs or equivalent education credentials, and industry recognized certifications; and 5) The number of participants who receive services that directly address and ameliorate the impact of the risk factors most common among female ex-offenders.

Credentials offered for In-Demand Industries: Internet Computing Core (IC3) Certification; Red Cross CPR, First Aid, AED and Universal Precautions; National Restaurant Association's ServSafe Program; and OSHA 10.

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
