#### All,

Attached please find a DRAFT version of our updated floodplain ordinance for your review and comment. The ordinance has been updated to meet the new State minimum requirements and to reflect current practices. This has been modified per previous reviews by FEMA and CWCB. I will also be updating the Rules and Regulations on a parallel path to update accordingly and eliminate duplication.

The ordinance must be adopted no later than Nov 20<sup>th</sup> in order to remain in good standing in the NFIP, and to adopt the new Digital Flood Insurance Rate Maps (DFIRMs).

Please document any comments as tracked changes in the attached document and send back to me by July 22. After which I will be sending out for a broader, more formal, review including you and other internal and external stakeholders.

#### Summary of Major Changes:

- State minimum freeboard is now 1.0' in all flood Zones. We currently have 1.5' freeboard, except in AO Zones where we currently have no freeboard. I am proposing a higher standard of 1.5' (instead of State's 1.0') of freeboard in AO Zones to be consistent with all other zones with regards to this factor of safety. AO Zones are based on "average flood depths" so a 1' depth AO Zone means flood depths of more than 1' in some areas and it seems appropriate to give a higher factor of safety for an area with less confidence in flood depths. In addition to extra protection, benefits of doing this include getting more credit in the CRS program for higher regulatory standards, and buildings with 1.5' of freeboard will end up getting rated as a +2 from the insurance company which results in lower flood insurance premiums than a building with a +1 rating.
- Freeboard for Critical Facilities is 2.0' (per State Regs).
- LOMR-F areas are regulated like any other floodplain area so that the lowest floor must be elevated (or dry floodproofed) with the same freeboard above the previous BFE (per State Regs).
- 0.5' floodway surcharge criteria (per State Regs).
- LOMR required for any increase or decrease in BFE in excess of 0.3' (per State Regs).

## Summary of Higher Local Standards:

- Lateral additions protected as new construction to minimize flood damages. This is how our ordinance has been interpreted and regulated, but the current language is vague so I'm formalizing it.
- No new mobile homes in floodplain (current City standard).
- 1.5' freeboard for all flood Zones including AO Zones (see above).

## Rob,

Per your request I am providing additional information for management regarding my recent proposal to increase freeboard in AO Zone floodplains from the state minimum of 1.0' to 1.5' in our forthcoming update to the floodplain ordinance. Please note that the following info only relates to AO Zone floodplains:

Q: What are the flood insurance benefits of providing an extra 0.5' of freeboard?

A: There are no direct flood insurance benefits because flood insurance rates in AO Zones are based on a "compliant" vs. "non-compliant" rate structure, not elevation based like other flood zones. There is a potential indirect benefit to flood insurance policy holder because it would be treated as a "higher standard" which is credited under the Community Rating System (CRS). This benefit is difficult to quantify because there are so many activities used to determine our class, but it will help towards the goal of increasing our class in the CRS program. Each class bump attains a 5% savings to the policyholders in the floodplain. Denver floodplain residents currently get a 10% discount on their flood insurance policies for our floodplain and stormwater management activities.

Q: How many new developments are there in AO Zone floodplains recently?

A: Since Jan 1, 2012 there have been 22 floodplain permit applications in AO Zones. Of those, only 8 are of the type of development (new structure, lateral addition, or substantial improvement) that would be impacted by increased freeboard. The remaining 14 projects would not be impacted by freeboard since they are roadway projects, utility projects, or non-substantial improvements.

Q: What is the cost of the additional 0.5' freeboard elevation requirement?

A: I don't know. The additional cost would not be directed to the City, but the cost to the private side may be influenced by other factors such as zoning height restrictions, etc...

Q: Why is this a good idea?

A: It provides additional factor of safety in AO Zones where published flood depths are average depths (meaning some areas will actually have flood depths higher than published values. The probability of flooding is the same as other flood zones, but there is less

confidence AO flood zone depths than our other flood zones which already have 1.5' of freeboard. This also creates consistency across all flood zones, which is less confusing and easier to regulate.

Q: Is there a variance process?

A: A floodplain specific variance process already defined in the ordinance, which is remaining technically the same under the proposed update. Floodplain variances are approved by the City Engineer but it is unknown if any additional variances would be submitted due to the additional freeboard.

Q: What are the implications of using the State minimum of 1' of freeboard in AO Zones?

A: Lower factor of safety and different freeboard in AO Zones than other flood zones.

With this information I am hopeful to obtain a decision from management regarding whether they wish to pursue 1.5' of freeboard in AO Zones, or set it to 1.0', per State regulation. Another option (suggested by councilman Nevitt) would be to immediately use 1.0' of freeboard and phase-in 1.5' after a year or two to allow developers time to plan accordingly. This phase-in option was not met with any opposition by the City Attorney's Office. Let me know if any additional information is needed for the decision. Thanks.

Per our meeting on Monday afternoon, attached and below please find the requested information as it relates to the proposed floodplain ordinance update:

- 1) Letters from the State & FEMA outlining the severe ramifications for not adopting an ordinance that meets the State's minimum regulations.
- 2) Example annual notification for residents that are located in the floodplain. I have clouded item #8 in the attached related to how residents are notified that permits are required for all construction in the floodplain.

Q: How many new developments are there in AO Zone floodplains recently?

A: Since Jan. 1, 2012 there have been 22 floodplain permit applications in AO Zones. Of those, only 8 are of the type of development (new structure, lateral addition, or substantial improvement) that would be impacted by increased freeboard. The remaining 14 projects are not be impacted by freeboard since they are roadway projects, utility projects, or non-substantial improvements.

Q: How many buildings are in the AO Zones?

A: There are 240 residential structures, 290 non-residential structures, and 311 accessory structures (sheds, garages, carports, etc...). Accessory structures, however, do not have as stringent floodplain requirement as the main structures.

We are planning on brining the ordinance to LUDI on Oct 8<sup>th</sup>, and desire to have the freeboard issue resolved prior to LUDI. I hope this information helps support your decision related to the proposed 1.5' of freeboard in AO Zones instead of the State minimum of 1.0'. Let me know if you have any additional questions.
