# 7. Describe the proposed ordinance, including what the proposed ordinance is intended to accomplish, who's involved

#### a. Scope of Work

Current: The City and County of Denver (City) currently has allocated up to \$460,000 of its formula Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) funding for a rebate program targeting small businesses in Denver that have made energy-efficiency improvements to their facilities. Mile High Business Alliance (MHBA) assists the Denver Department of Environmental Health (DEH) with processing these rebates and issuing rebate payments to businesses. Amendment: DEH proposes to amend the contract to add \$500,000 of its Better Buildings Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) funding to continue the existing rebate program as part of the larger Denver Energy Challenge managed by DEH.
