16	notwithstanding any provision in this Code. Such violations shall be considered property violations	
17	for which the City may assess a lien against the property in violation pursuant to Article XII of	
18	Chapter 2 of this Code. Enforcement actions are in	tended to be cumulative in nature. The city may
