

Historic Denver's Petition to Save the Beth Eden Church:

Beth Eden Church has stood at 3241 Lowell since 1892, and the current Tudor Revival style 1931 building has been a recognized and orienting feature and a cultural and architectural landmark for the West Highlands Community for 83 years.

The preservation of the church structure will contribute to the dynamic between old and new that creates vibrancy in our city. Retaining the church is sustainable and contributes significantly to the character of the neighborhood. The incorporation of this structure into a future development adds value to the project and to the community.

I support the preservation of the Beth Eden Church building at 3241 Lowell Boulevard.

the proposed huge unwanted development in the Highlands Square area, 32nd and Lowell, Mead and Moncrieff have been resolved, it is now time for the neighborhood to move quickly to resolve the parking situation in the Highland Square area. Parking in this area has been a problem for over 15 years and to date the City's solution has been to issue residential parking permits and patrol the area for scofflaws issuing parking tickets to violators.
