Would love to be reappointed to the board.

1) Please describe your general experience serving on this board, how has it gone?

Enjoy working with the other two board members, and with Lori she's been great addition to the line of commissioners supporting the Denver Ethics Board. City Council and the Mayor have been very supportive in creating members that reflect the community. I've enjoyed the experience very much, and learning about the City, and sharing my passion.

2) What specific contributions or achievements have you personally been a part of on this board?

Our job is to provide nominees that will serve on the Board. Jane Feldman is just being reappointed for a second term, and its exciting to see someone start the process, and see the contributions that she's been able to make through the board of ethics. Joseph who has headed up the board has done a terrific job, along with Jane in enhancing the ordinance of the BoE enhancing the way it can better serve the city. It's been great to hear them continuing that effort.

3) What goals or intentions do you hope to personally bring to the board going forward?

Different than the other two folks, Brian is an attorney and has served as president of the ethics board, Michelle comes out of a judicial background, and my hope is to bring the voice of the common person. I have my own business in Denver and all of my customers are outside of the state so I don't have any direct conflicts with what's happening here in the City, and that hasn't changed since I was first nominated to the board.
