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What is the Annual Program Ordinance?



A Citywide “Contracts Working Group” was formed 9/2/2009 as part of an initiative to streamline city contracting processes



The “Annual Program Ordinance” was a recommendation of this working group



Expedites the contracting of select routine, annual work programs within the Department of Transportation and Infrastructure

Which programs fit?

- Nature of work varies little from year to year
- Relatively defined pool of qualified contractors
- Large work programs that benefit from expedited start

Typical Contracted Work

- Street paving
- Concrete work (curb, gutter, and ADA pedestrian ramp construction)
- Traffic signal construction and reconstruction
- Faded signs/pavement markings
- General storm/annual sanitary improvements



What does the ordinance do?

- Allows work to be bid and contracted more expediently (get an early start!)
- Waives requirement that each individual contract be submitted and approved separately
- Allows for a report to be provided quarterly to City Council with relevant data

History

- First Annual Program Ordinance was filed for 2011 annual work program
- Has been requested, filed and approved by City Council each year since 2011
- Requires a report be provided quarterly to City Council with relevant data

Good to know

- All contracts are publicly advertised and competitively awarded to the lowest responsive bidder(s)
- All contracts meet contracting standards, including SBE or M/WBE requirements, diversity and inclusivity requirements, as well as responsiveness review by DSB0. **No short cuts!**
- Quarterly Report provided to City Council detailing contracts awarded, noting program goals and awards to certified prime contractors

2019 Update

- 12 Contracts Awarded
- 6 of the 12 contracts awarded were to certified MWBE or SBE primes
- Total Contract Value - \$25M
\$7.8M awarded to certified prime contractors
