

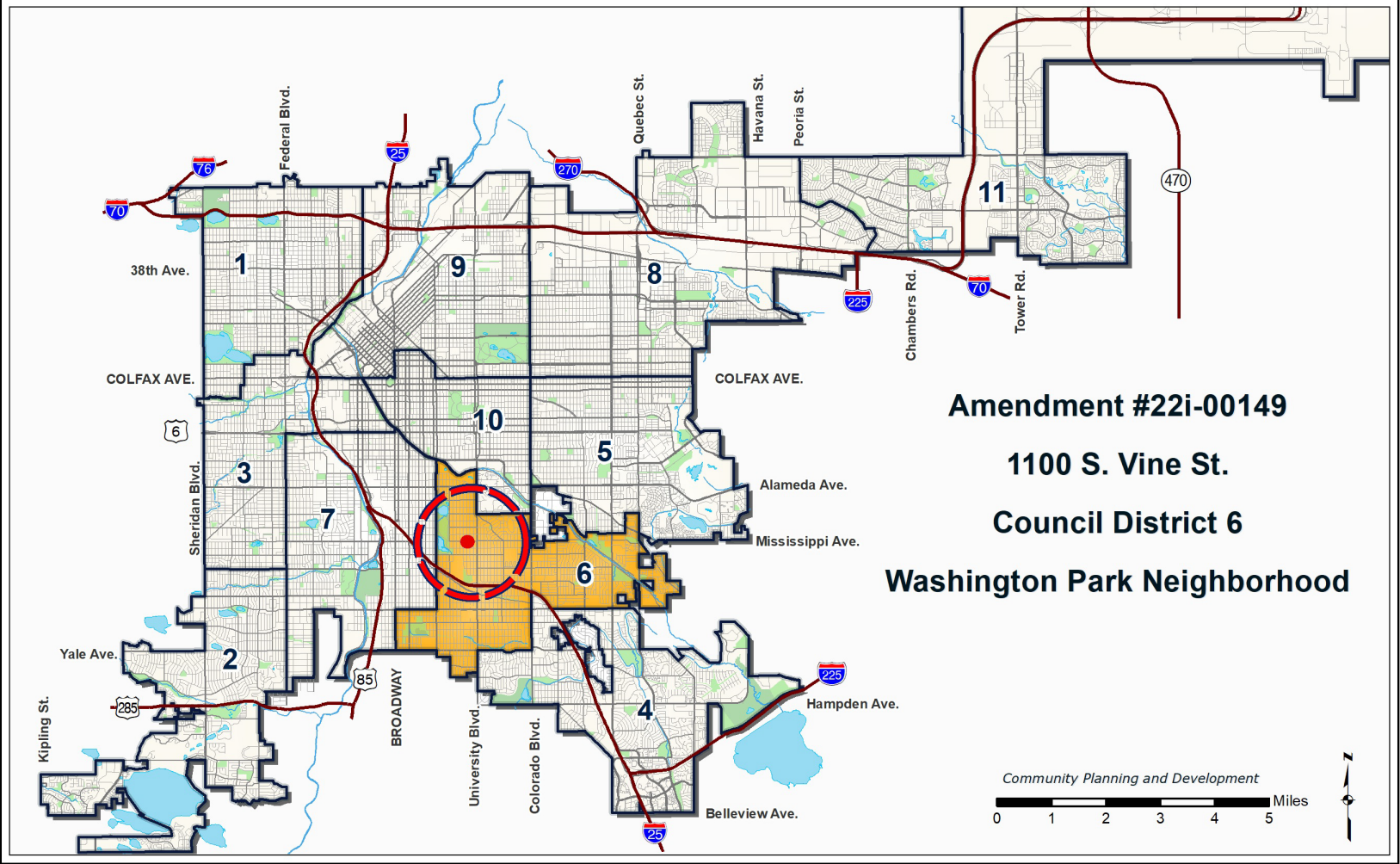

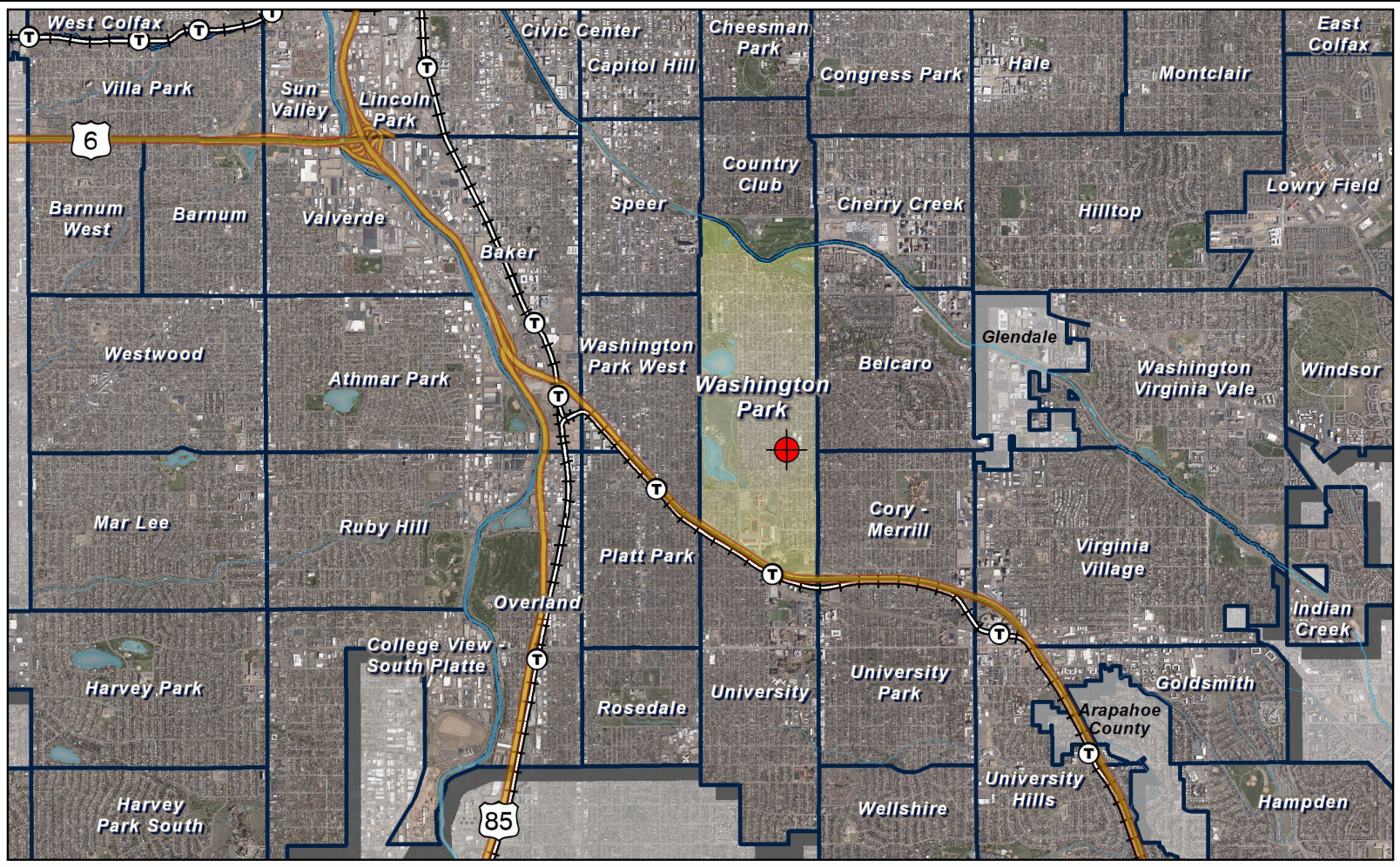

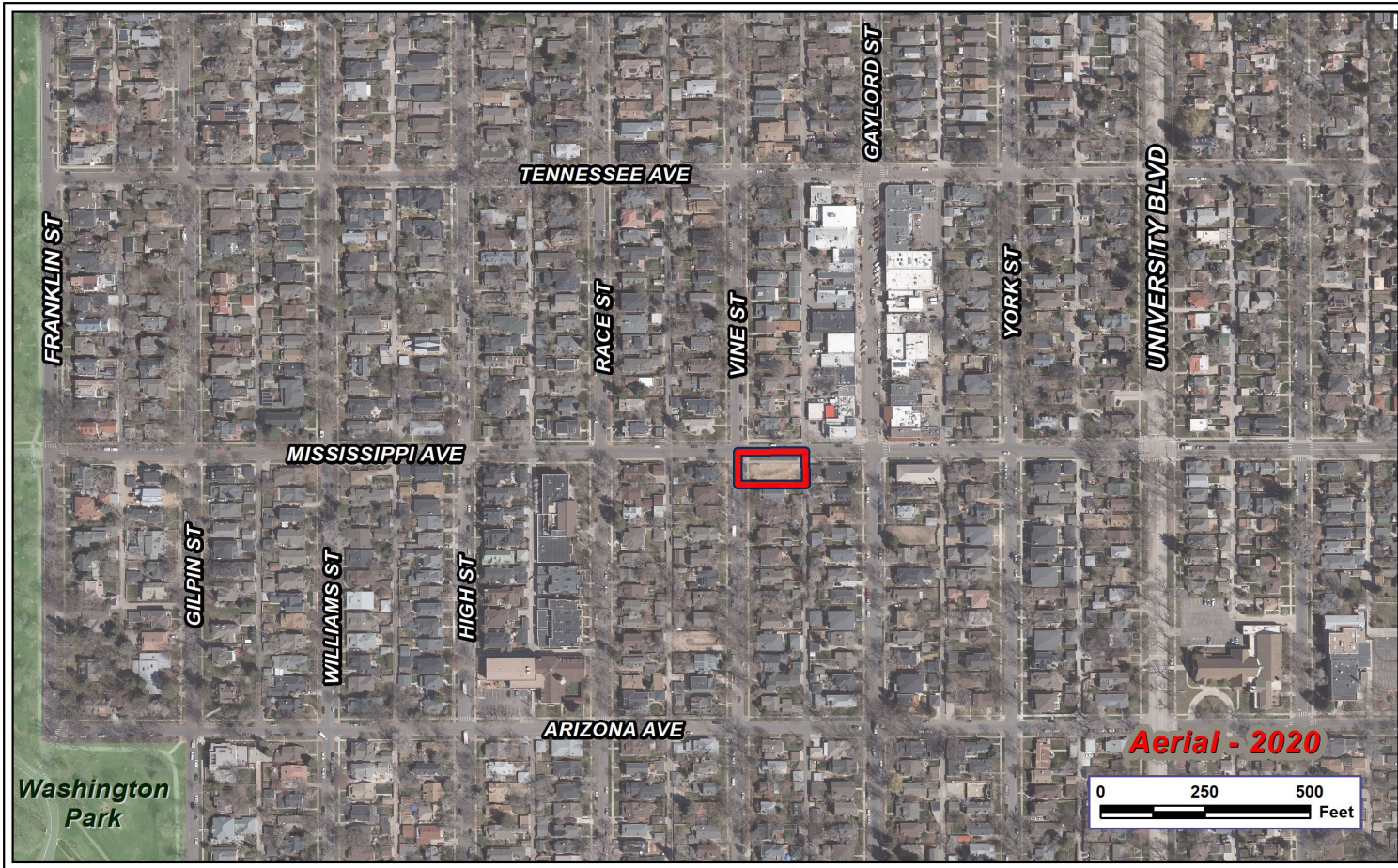

Existing

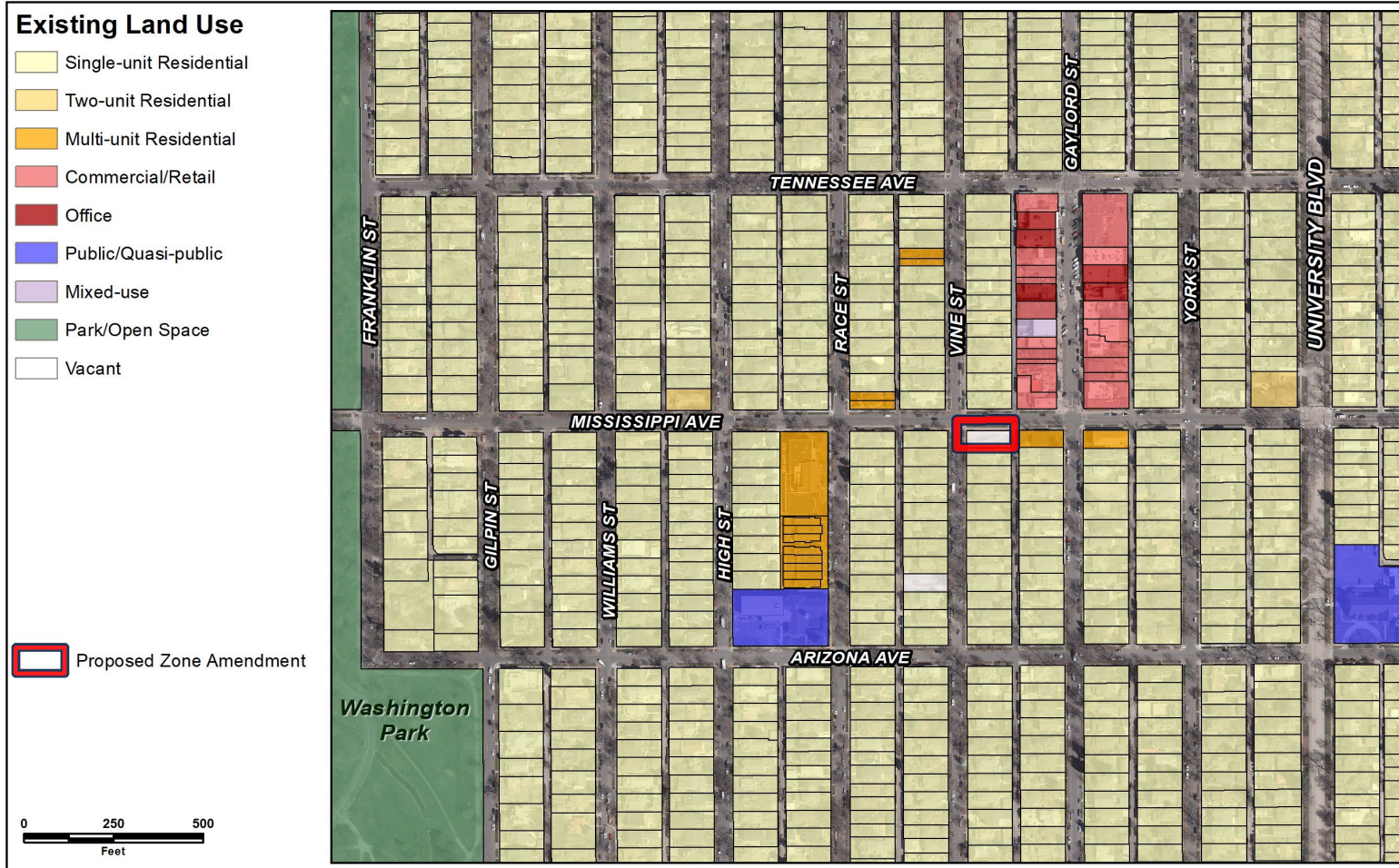
- Approx. 6,300 square feet
- Urbn - Single Unit - C
 - 5,500 sq. ft. minimum lot size
 - Urban House
 - Max. building height 30-35 feet, 24 feet for ADU

Proposal

- Rezoning from E-SU-Dx to E-SU-D1x
- Urbn - Single Unit - C1
 - 5,500 sq. ft. minimum lot size
 - Urban House and ADUs allowed
 - Max. building height 30-35 feet, 24 feet for ADU

Reminder: Approval of a rezoning is not approval of a proposed specific development project

Existing Land Use

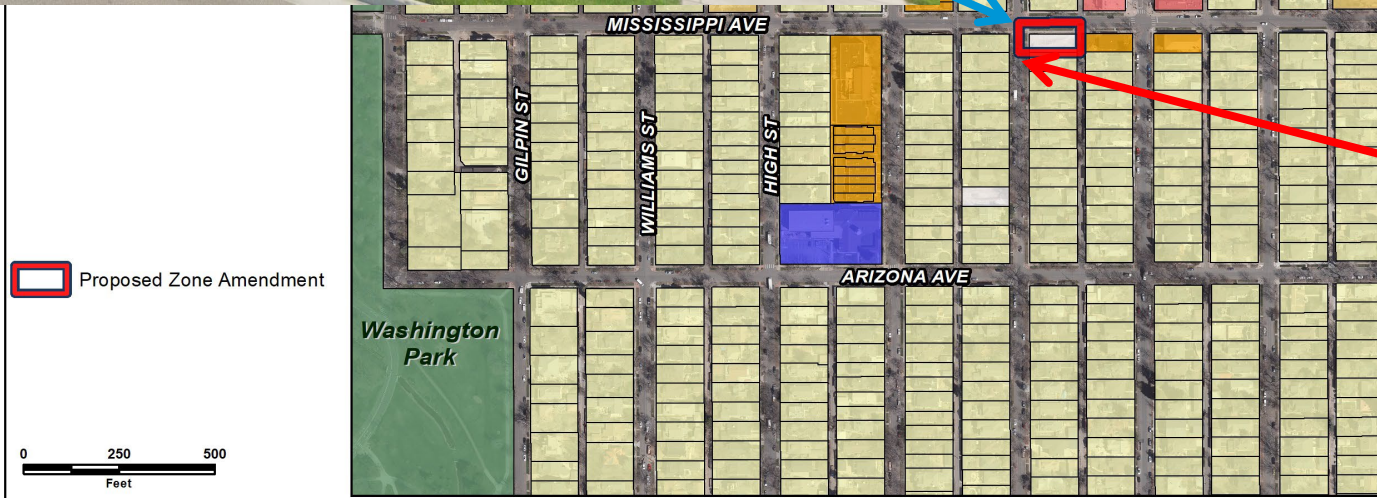
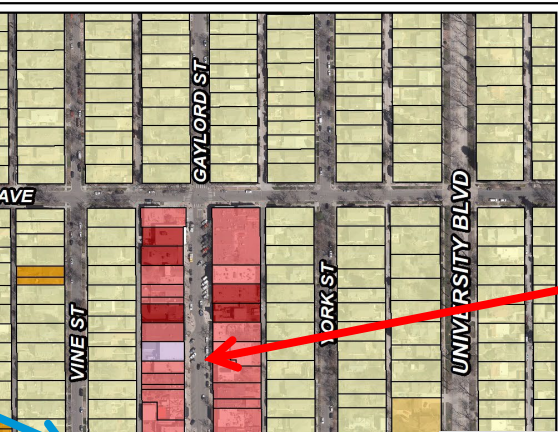


Subject property: Single-Unit Residential

Equity

- Equitable, Affordable and Inclusive Goal 2, Strategy A: Create a greater mix of housing options in every neighborhood for all individuals and families (p. 28).



Climate

- Environmentally Resilient Goal 8, Strategy A: Promote infill development where infrastructure and services are already in place (p. 54).



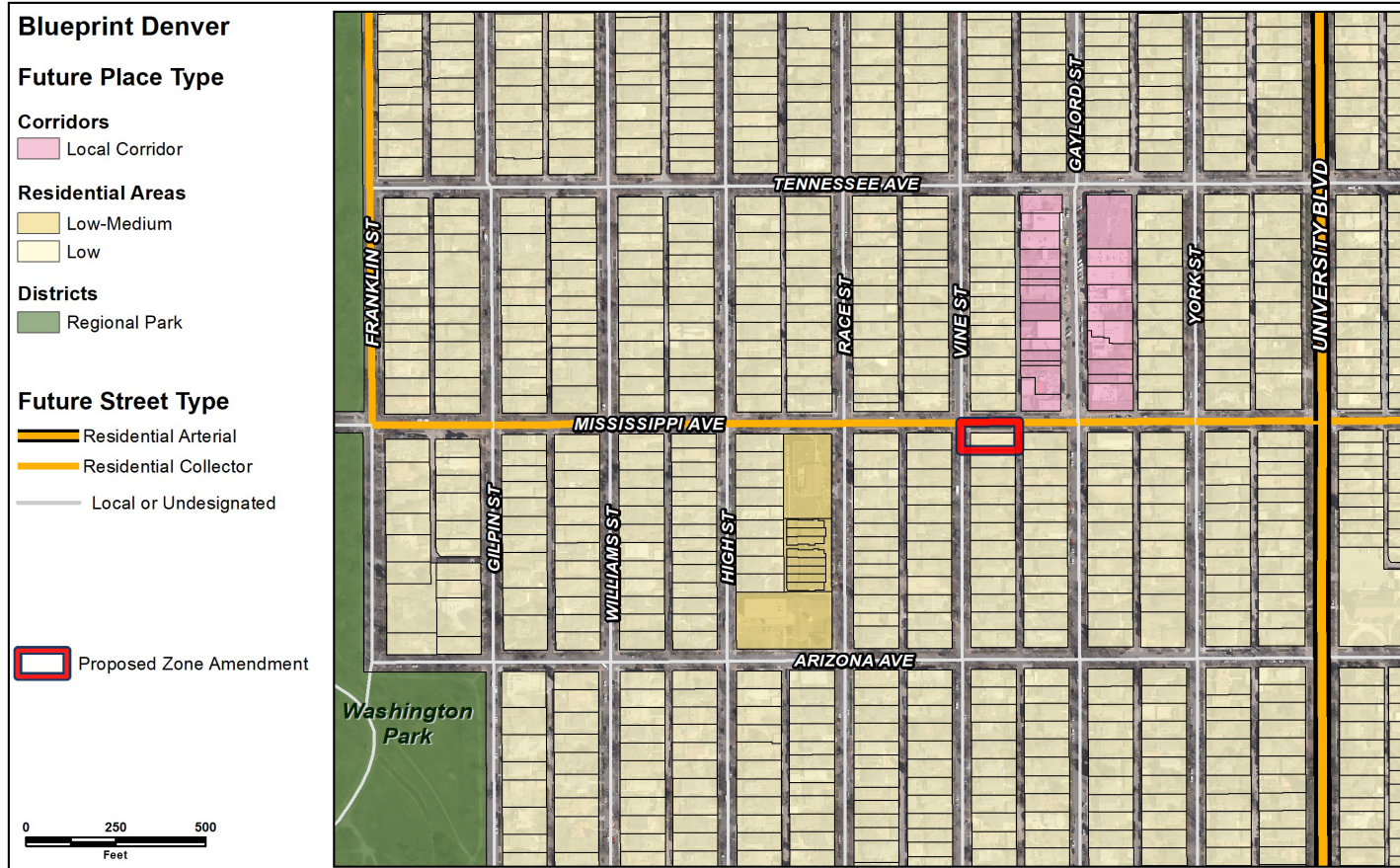
Consistency with Adopted Plans: Blueprint Denver 2019



Urban

- Small multi-unit residential and low-intensity mixed-use buildings are typically embedded in single-unit and two-unit residential areas.
- Block patterns are a regular grid with consistent alley access.
- Where they occur, multi-unit buildings are low-scale.
- Mixed-use buildings are sited in a pedestrian-friendly manner near the street

Consistency with Adopted Plans: Blueprint Denver 2019



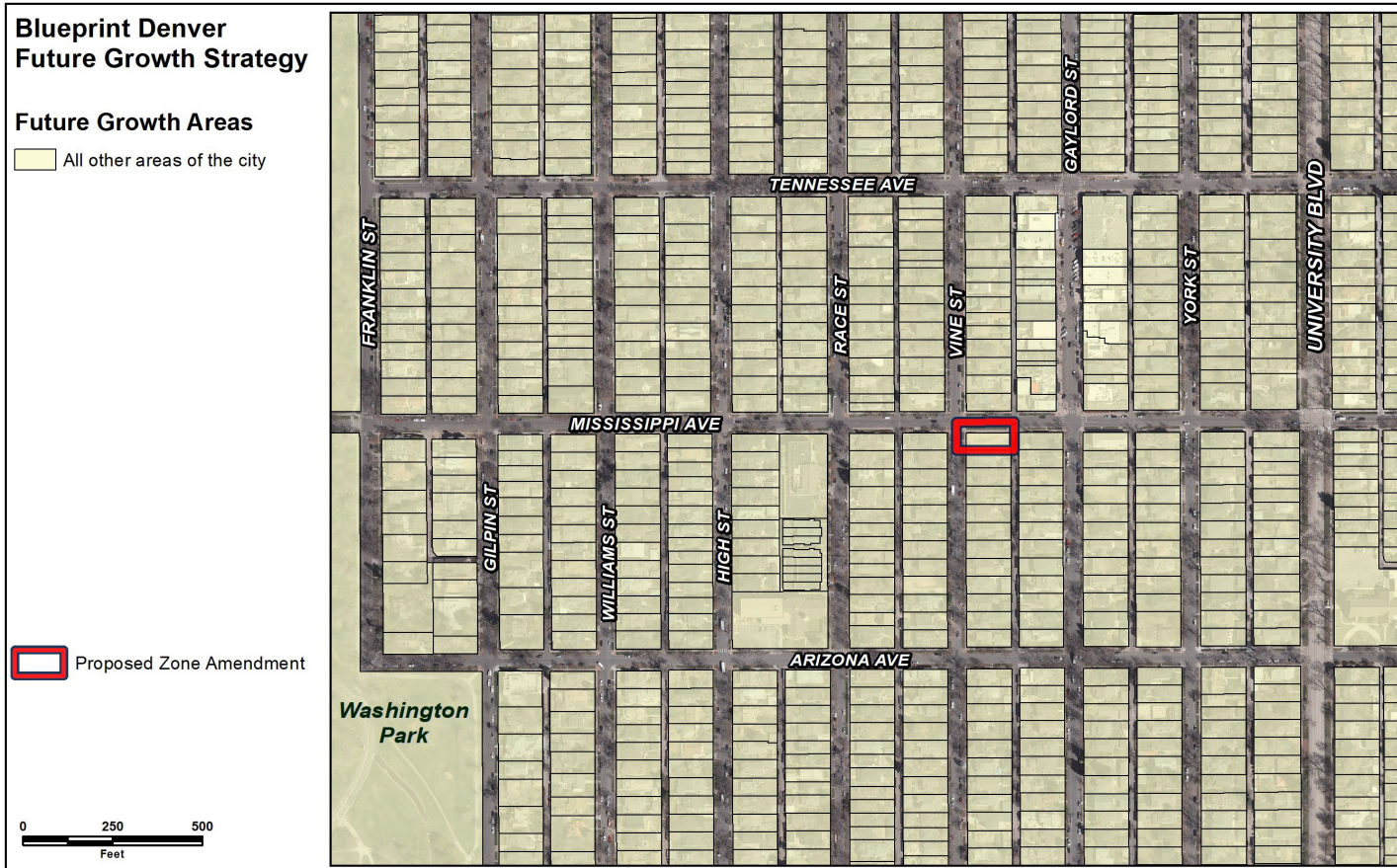
Low Residential

- Predominantly single- and two-unit uses
- Accessory dwelling units are appropriate

Future Street Type

- Mississippi Ave: Residential Collector
- Vine Street: Undesignated Local

Consistency with Adopted Plans: Blueprint Denver



- **Growth Areas Strategy: All other areas of the city**
 - 10% jobs by 2040
 - 20% housing by 2040

Consistency with Adopted Plans: Blueprint Denver

Policy 4: Diversity housing choice through the expansion of accessory dwelling units throughout all residential areas.

Strategy E: A citywide approach to enable ADUs is preferred. Until a holistic approach is in place, individual rezoning to enable ADUs in all residential areas, especially where proximate to transit, are appropriate. Unless there is a neighborhood plan supporting ADUs, rezonings should be small in area in order to minimize impact to the surrounding residential area.

4. Justifying Circumstances

- Since the date of the approval of the existing Zone District, there has been a change to such a degree that the proposed rezoning is in the public interest. Such change may include:
 - a) Changed or changing conditions in a particular area, or in the city generally; or,
 - b) **A City adopted plan; or,**
 - c) That the City adopted the Denver Zoning Code and the property retained Former Chapter 59 zoning.
