Section 3. That Section 3 of Ordinance Number 426, Series of 2007, as amended by Ordinance Number 191, Series of 2001, now reading,

"No changes can be made which affect the total funding amount for each

1 purpose. Within each purpose, the expending authority may decrease the 2 amount specified for any particular project by up to ten (10) percent of the 3 total amount specified for the project in order to transfer money to other 4 projects within the same purpose. However, the expending authority may 5 expend bond premium generated and interest earned by purpose on any 6 project eligible to receive bond funding. Any other modifications will require an amendment of this Ordinance by the Denver City Council." 7 8 is hereby amended to read follows: as 9 "No changes can be made which affect the total funding amount for 10 each purpose. Within each purpose, the expending authority may decrease 11 the amount specified for any particular project by up to ten (10) percent of 12 the total amount specified for the project in order to transfer money to other projects within the same purpose. For projects which are completed as 13 intended by this Ordinance, and have less than \$100,000.00 in 14 15 remaining funding, these funds may be transferred to other projects 16 within the same purpose. However, the expending authority may expend 17 bond premium generated and interest earned by purpose on any project 18 eligible to receive bond funding.
