Dallin Maybee is Seneca and enrolled Northern Arapaho. Raised on the Cattaraugus Indian Reservation in Western New York, he is a multimedia artist working in a variety of forms. His artistic journey began with learning various beadwork, leatherwork, and feather-work techniques in the construction of his outfits and regalia for Iroquois social dancing and intertribal powwow competitions. He is an accomplished Northern Traditional dancer as well as hoop dancer. He has traveled extensively throughout the world with various dance groups, including the acclaimed American Indian Dance Theater.

His art mediums include beadwork, oil painting, jewelry, ledger art, and carving. He has won numerous awards during his 20 year artist career including Best of Show at the prestigious Santa Fe Indian Market in 2007 and most recently. Best of Show at the 2020 Cherokee Art Market. His art can be found in private collections as well as in museums throughout the country including the National Museum of the American Indian, the Autry Museum, the Fleard Museum, and the Portland Art Museum.

Dallin has earned a B.A. degree in Philosophy from Utah Valley University as well as a Juris Doctorate from the Sandra Day O'Conner College of Law. He is the former Chief Operating Officer of the non-profit that produced the Santa Fe Indian Market and is currently Assistant Director of Development for the Native American Rights Fund in Boulder, Colorado.

INDIGENOUS COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

I consider mysell humbled and grateful to have supported and been involved in several campaigns and events related to Indian Country. This first began for me in the late 1990's during efforts to remove a racist Native mascot at my high school alma mater in Skownegan, Maine. While this initial movement succeeded in eliminating harmful iconography and language in the majority non-Native school, the name remained until the movement was revitalized on behalf of the Penobscot Nation and finally removed in 2019. As part of the group, Not Your Mascot - Maine Chapter, we successfully petitioned Covernor Janet Mills to pass legislation to prohibit Native mascots in the state in 2019; the first in the country to do so. In 2020, I worked with the Pikes Peak Indigenous Women's Alliance IPPIWA) to successfully petition District 12 in Colorado Springs to remove their Nalive mascot and provided testimony to Senate and House in support of SB 21-116, the Prohibition of American Indian Mascots in Colorado Schoots. Additional work includes support and organization of rallies and events related to MMIW and Indian Boarding Schoolrelated issues with PPIWA. Most recently, I have been involved as a member of the MMIR Taskforce of CO to bring awareness and develop solutions to the crisis level of violence against Indigenous people in CO. I have also supported non-Native centered organizations on policy campaigns, victim advocacy, and education to include NARAL Planned Parenthood, RAINN, Disabled American Veterans - Military Sexual Trauma, PFLAG, and the Human Rights Campaign.

I am eager to work with so many brilliant community members and would appreciate the opportunity to bring my own energy, learn and give back to our community. I recognize the commission advises the mayor and would love the opportunity to collaborate and cultivate the ideas of the Denver Indian community through the DAIC.

I am a Navajo Enrolled and Lakota Affiliated powwow dancer. Raised in the powwow circle, I understand the cultural significance of being represented in modern issues as well as honoring traditional values in community. I learned how to find my voice and speak for American Indian issues at a young age. I have since developed my passion for speaking about my lived experiences as a Navajo/Lakota Mother.

I worked 10 years in retail management. Through dedication and passion, I was promoted several times to Management and Supervisory positions. I learned effective communication skills and de-escalation tactics to support clients to a resolution. I use multiple training tactics to help navigate new associates in their positions through mentoring and coaching.

At present, I am working to provide resources to Indigenous/American Indian community through my job at Denver Human Services. To answer questions from co-workers, including what programs are available to Denver tribal members, what being a tribal member means and how that differs when someone isn't enrolled in a tribe but states they are affiliated, I am collaborating with a group in my division to provide accurate referrals to community partners. I also strive to strengthen relationships with clients by using cultural teachings from the White Buffalo Calf Woman, such as humility, compassion, and honesty.

I am a self-taught artist/beadworker. I know that beadwork doesn't come out perfectly, which has taught me patience and how to allow things to happen naturally. It takes drive and motivation to complete regalia, and I hold myself accountable for what is in my control. I apply this kind of drive and motivation to my work as well as my everyday life. I think it's important to continue to build on the foundation we have in Denver to expand and improve community projects that benefit Denver Native members.

I'm committed to supporting Indigenous communities through direct action, volunteering and advocacy. I believe my insight from the frontlines to foster culturally appropriate services and practices would be a valuable addition to the DAIC and would be honored to serve my city and my community as a member.

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I am from the Oglala Lakota Sioux Tribe, from Wounded Knee District on the Pine Ridge Reservation in South Dakota.

Moved to Denver in 1989 with family.

In 2014, I became sober for my family. Experiencing death and health hardships with loved ones due to addictions, 7 years sober now feeling this positive change for the better has been able to let me feel and love through my own self-strength, my love for the people, family, and my desire to help others with goals to start a non-profit organization in Sobriety Wellness cultural spirituality as a licensed Addictions counselor therapist.

Through growing life changes, I've become the voice of our Native community while also speaking up and speaking out for myself and the community. I was very surprised and honored when asked by a non-profit organization, Bayaud Enterprises Inc., to be part of the new professional speakers group called the "Speaker's Network." I was honored and grateful to be a voice for the people – respectfully and with my best intentions. It is both humbling and awakening.

Over the past 15 years, I've been a member/volunteer of our Native Community Talking Circles in downtown Denver and surrounding counties, with representation all nations. Now, through a Colorado Coalition for the Homeless grant for our own Native American Services Program, there will be a program that offers resources, housing, addiction and cultural services, and more. We have plans for a Native American Homeless Shelter, just confirmed a Native American Housing Coordinator Position, and I've been elected to serve on Metro Denver Homeless Initiative Organization, HUD/COC Board of Directors in November 2019 and currently VP of HUD Continuum of Care Committees.

I currently work as Peer Navigator with the Community Resources Department at Denver Public Library.
