In this role, Ford will prioritize increasing mobility and safety while reducing congestion and fighting climate change. She will lead the teams that plan, design, build, and maintain the city's infrastructure.

Amy Ford brings proven executive leadership at transportation agencies and a long career in the transportation industry. She has managed multi-hundred-million-dollar budgets and teams responsible for operations, public affairs and innovation, and served as a global strategist guiding growth, program development and policy to best move toward a mobility future that benefits everyone.

Ford currently leads Surface Transportation and Innovation for the Global Transportation business at AECOM, leading global strategy for transformative mobility as well as transportation decarbonization programs.

Prior to joining AECOM, Ford led the strategic direction and activities of the Mobility of Demand (MOD) Alliance and Intelligent Transportation Society of

America's policy programs. She also served as the Chief of Advanced Mobility for the Colorado Department of Transportation where she was responsible for accelerating transportation operations, strategic communications and innovation programs, policies and projects, including digital infrastructure, connected automated technologies and workforce of the future.

Ford has lived in Denver for over 25 years. Passionate about her city and building an equitable future, she founded the Fax Partnership, a long-term non-profit and community development corporation focused on revitalizing East Colfax.
