A BILL

For an ordinance authorizing expenditures in the General Government Special Revenue Fund based on a letter of intent from the United States Department of Homeland Security to fund the City and County of Denver for the “2022 Securing the Cities” program.

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Homeland Security has sent a letter of intent (LOI) to the Office of Emergency Management stating a continuation of funds for 2022; and

WHEREAS, the City and County of Denver has given due consideration to said letter of intent, a copy of which is duly filed with the City Clerk, Filing No. 20220070;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

Section 1. Expenditures are hereby authorized from the General Government Special Revenue Fund, Accounting No. 11000, the amount of money in the following tabulation to be expended for the purposes and upon the authorizations in said Ordinance set forth:

Section 2. The Chief Financial Officer of the City and County of Denver is hereby authorized and directed to make such book and record entries and to do such other things as may be necessary to accomplish the purposes of this Ordinance.
