Worked closely with elected and appointed county officials to discuss unmet needs and their ramifications on service delivery. Provided follow-up and evaluation studies on effective services and advised management on desirable changes and improvements. Identified, researched, edited, and prepared all grant applications/proposals to foundations. Strategically developed budget, program expansion, and prioritized funding goals.
