## **Mile High Business Alliance**

The City and County of Denver (City) currently has allocated up to \$460,000 of its formula Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) funding for a rebate program targeting small businesses in Denver that have made energy-efficiency improvements to their facilities. Mile High Business Alliance (MHBA) assists the Denver Department of Environmental Health (DEH) with processing these rebates and issuing rebate payments to businesses. MHBA works closely with DEH to process rebates in an efficient, timely, transparent, and welldocumented fashion.

The rebate program has been a very successful tool of the Denver Energy Challenge for businesses (a program managed by DEH), with over 400 business participants and a savings over 3 million kWh annually by those taking part in the rebate program specifically. DEH proposes adding \$500,000 of its Better Buildings Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) funding to the existing rebate program so that efforts can continue in a seamless and efficient manner as part of the Denver Energy Challenge.
