 - a. Scope of Work

The ordinance approves a loan agreement with Affordable Communities, Inc. for the purchase and rehabilitation of a foreclosed rental property located at 4410-4412 Morrison Road, Denver, Colorado. The property has been foreclosed upon by the lender. NSP 2 was authorized under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009. The City and County of Denver has been awarded \$18,994,444. The City will provide a loan in the amount of \$1,287,261 to Affordable Communities, Inc. to implement NSP2. The Housing and Economic Recovery Act (HERA) of 2008 originally established the NSP and appropriated funds to address the effects of abandoned and foreclosed properties in the nation's communities.
