**A BILL**

**For an ordinance making appropriations in the Winter Park Parks and Recreation Capital Fund.**

**WHEREAS**, the City receives an incentive payment for parks capital maintenance from the Winter Park Recreational Association (WPRA) per the terms of the Winter Park Lease and Operating Agreement by September 30<sup>th</sup> each year; and

**WHEREAS**, the 2018 incentive payment from WPRA has been received in the amount of \$1,793,710, of which \$600,000 has been included in the 2018 Capital Improvement Projects Budget; and

**WHEREAS**, the City and County of Denver has identified the projects to be funded by the remaining \$1,193,710;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:**

**Section 1.** Expenditures are hereby authorized from the Winter Parks Park and Recreation Fund, Accounting No. 30001, the amounts of money in the following tabulation to be expended for the purposes and upon the authorizations in said Ordinance set forth:

The foregoing appropriation for the City Park Pavilion Renovation project will be used to support the maintenance and renovations of the first floor kitchen and north bathrooms, as well as bring the fire alarm and lighting systems up to current standards. The foregoing appropriation for the Urban Farm Rehabilitation will support critical maintenance improvements to the Urban Farm at Stapleton, including upgrading the ADA and life/safety systems, heating/cooling system, restrooms, roof,

1 lighting and interior finishes, as well as work on exterior walls and site work to provide ADA-compliant  
2 parking and pedestrian access.

3 **Section 2.** The Chief Financial Officer of the City and County of Denver is hereby authorized  
4 and directed to make such book and record entries and to do such other things as may be necessary  
5 to accomplish the purposes of this Ordinance.
