- Funds were allocated in December 2014 to BIF account

PESCO Site Selection

- National search of over 20 cities
- Finalist: Denver and Dallas
- Presented several sites in Denver, based on company requirements
- Denver announced as the PESCO HQ and facility in December 2014

- 61st & Pena Blvd.
 - Anchor for 400 acre Master Planned TOD Community @ Pena Boulevard Station
 - Catalyst for future retail, commercial, residential and business development

- 2 stories

- 61st Frontage
- Easy walk access





Development Timing

- PESCO scheduled to open in Spring 2016
 - Development Services is leading development coordination efforts
 - Metro District improvements
 - PESCO building
 - Build to Suit developer selected
- RTD's FasTracks East Line to open in Spring 2016
- OED, property owners and DIA are continue efforts to attract others to this location
 - Potential other parallel developments (230 mixed income MF housing, hotel, and retail)
- Additional area improvements
 - Solar grid system, wayfinding, multi-modal enhancements





Business Incentive Fund (BIF) Award

- \$1.35M award for business location and job creation
 - Building and capital investment
 - Job creation
 - Targeted industry cluster and HQ

Award will reimburse for job creation and building & operational opening

- Incentives tied to specific performance outcomes, only incentives paid after company opens and hires new workers
- Contract period of 5 years; anticipate majority of funds paid in 2016 and 2017

Outcomes



300 total new jobs

- o BIF incentive for 250 jobs (performance based)
- Mix of executive level headquarter and assembly jobs
 - Helps address Denver's need for additional middle-skill manufacturing jobs
- Total payroll \$32.6M annually (Year 5); Avg income about \$90K per year

Estimated capital investment of \$35M

- 100,000 sqft office and assembly facility
- State of art sustainable and renewable energy building
- Advanced technology development and testing
 - · Exploring partnerships with NREL and local businesses and education

Fiscal Benefit (only from PESCO project)

- Estimated to exceed \$2.65M in direct General Fund benefit
- Indirect benefits to exceed \$2.7M
- Other Denver Public Schools \$4.3M
