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- 5. Describe the proposed ordinance, including what the proposed ordinance is intended to accomplish, who's involved
 - a. Scope of Work

This amendment of an agreement between the Urban Drainage and Flood Control District (UDFCD) adds additional funds for the design and construction of a storm drainage system from 40th Street and Blake to the South Platte River. The system is an 8' by 10' box culvert with a round pipe section under the Union Pacific Railroad. This funding is for 2 projects: High Street Outfall Phase 1 and High Street Outfall Phase 2. High Street Outfall Phase 1 has is currently starting construction while phase 2 is anticipated to advertise in early 2014. This amendment adds \$2,300,000 of UDFCD capital funds to \$9,139,000 of UDFCD funds and \$884,000 of CCD enterprise funds already agreed to and provided to UDFCD by CCD for a total of \$12,323,000. These funds are held by the UDFCD and the UDFCD is managing design while CCD will manage construction. The UDFCD matches funds for projects on a 50%/50% basis with local municipalities.

b. Duration

Terminates 3 years after construction is complete. Estimated at 2018.

c. Location

40th Street and Blake northwest to Brighton Boulevard, northeast on Brighton Boulevard approximately 650 feet, northwest across Pepsi Bottling Group property, through the Denver Coliseum parking lot, and outfalling in Globeville Landing Park.

d. Affected Council District

Provide 5-year storm conveyance for a major drainage basin without a gulch, creek or river.
