5. General description or background of proposed request. Attach executive summary if more space needed:

The City has generated a significant number of unforeseen unemployment insurance claims in 2020 due to the response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Examples include claims from on-call employees, such as in the Parks department as the City closed recreation centers to comply with public health orders, as well as other employees whose reduction in pay from mandated furlough days allowed them to apply for unemployment support.

In each of the last few years, the General Fund's share of unemployment has averaged around \$550,000. However, YTD the General Fund share of unemployment is \$2,775,100, and BMO is projecting a total of \$4,243,400 for 2020. The Federal CARES Act will pay up to 50% of the unemployment claims between March 13th and December 30th, which leaves a balance of \$2,200,000 to be paid by the City. The original 2020 appropriation for unemployment was \$600,000.

General Fund contingency is currently \$13,411,272. If this supplemental appropriation of \$1,640,000 is approved, the amount remaining in contingency will be \$11,771,272.
