



Committee Consent Agenda

Business Development

BR15- Approves a lease agreement with Air General, Inc. a cargo handler, at 0537 an annual rate of \$103,250 and through 12-31-16 to provide cargo handling services at Denver International Airport (201522273).

BR15- Approves a service agreement with Customs and Border Protection at 0538 an annual rate of \$934,000 and through 1-1-20 to increase the operating hours of the Federal Inspection Facility (FIS) at DIA (201520260).

BR15- Amends a lease agreement with ABX Air, Inc. by extending the term a 0524 year and ten months for a new end date of 12-31-16 for airline cargo services (AC 46003-01).

Finance & Services

BR15- Adds one year and \$1.75 million to the current contract with Extreme 0530 Towing & Recovery (for a new end date of 7-31-16, or 5 years, and total of \$8 million) for citywide towing services (201100630).
(Note: This contract is used by Sheriffs, Police, Right-of-Way Enforcement and for City vehicles that need towing. It is the last extension before rebidding the contract. Technology Services is currently developing new software for the impound lot that will affect the towing contract which should be completed in January after which the contract will be rebid.)

BR15- Approves a \$592,175.98 annual payment to Software House 0528 International for Oracle Database maintenance and support from 8-30-15 through 8-31-16 for city systems including 3-1-1, PeopleSoft, financial and tax systems and the like (EAPPS0000005104).
(Note: This contract was bid last year and each year the City pays a negotiated amount for maintenance based on the number of databases (96), plus a 5% cost adjustment that is standard in this industry.)

RR15- Sets a public hearing on the Service Plans for the formation and 0542 establishment of two Title 32 districts: West Globeville Metropolitan District No. 1 and West Globeville Metropolitan No. 2. (Note: The service plans for the metropolitan districts will be discussed in Committee on August 11. This resolution simply sets the date for the public hearing per state notice requirements.)

Infrastructure & Culture

BR15- Approves a one-year \$996,833.22 on-call contract with Jacobs 0531 Investments/Colorado Boring, LLC for directional boring to install electrical conduits citywide to support traffic signals rebuild programs, interconnects systems, and intelligent traffic system infrastructures. Each project will be scoped, priced and authorized separately (201522601).

(Note: This contract is a new bid and the contractor is chosen to do this work by bid for up to three years if the first year is acceptable. Public Works estimates the annual need and may not use all the funding in the on-call contract.)

RR15- Approves the subdivision plat for Pena Station Filing No. 1 at Tower 0533 Road and 61st Avenue in Council District 11.

RR15- Approves the subdivision plat for Denver International Business Center 0534 Filing No. 5 at Tower Road and 67th Avenue in Council District 11.

RR15- Dedicates land as North Tennyson Street near the intersection of North 0540 Tennyson Street and West Wells Place in Council District 1.

RR15- Dedicates land as public alley bounded by West 19th Avenue, West 20th 0532 Avenue, Hooker Street, and Grove Street as part of the City Side Townhomes development project in Council District 1.

RR15- Dedicates land as public alley bounded by W. 22nd Ave., W. 23rd Ave., 0527 Eliot St. and Federal Blvd as part of the Jefferson Park West Townhomes in Council District 1.

Routine, non-controversial requests for ordinances that are not substantive policy changes may be placed on Consent Agendas for Council Committees each week with the approval of Committee chairs. Councilmembers receive the consent agendas for review and have until Thursday at noon to request that an item be scheduled for Committee discussion.
