- BR14-0170 Vacates the alley bounded by 16th Street and Kensing Court and between Boulder Street and Hirshorn Park in Council District 9.
- BR14-0171 Vacates Kensing Court between Boulder Street and Hirshorn Park for redevelopment in Council District 9.
