22	WHEREAS, in 2023 Colorado SB23-210 repealed C.R.S. §19-3-211(b) and required the State				
23	Department of Human Services to adopt rules concerning the statewide implementation of a child				
24	welfare conflict resolution process for all counties, including referring complaints to the Office of the				
25	Child Protection Ombudsman for investigation at the complainant's request.
