a. Scope of Work

The Airport requests approval to enter into a loan agreement with Constellation Solar V, LLC to develop a 4.5MWDC photovoltaic (PV) solar electricity generating system that will provide power to the grid that will be used on the DIA site.

This request is to approve a loan agreement to authorize the Airport to loan \$7,500,000 to Constellation Solar V, LLC at a rate of 5.5% for a term of 20 years. The loan will be repaid in 20 equal annual installments from power and Renewable Energy Certificate (REC) revenues. The loan will be collateralized by the solar system and REC payments made to the owner through the Solar Rewards Program. This provides low cost capital to the investment partners that lowers the power purchase price to less than Xcel rates.
