6. **General description of proposed ordinance including contract scope of work if applicable:**

The purpose of this contract is to contract with Recycled Materials Company to operate, maintain and manage asphalt and concrete recycle facilities at DIA. There are presently two recycle yards, approximately 30 acres in size each, that are being maintained at DIA. The south yard is located at 71st Ave. and Jackson Gap St. and the north yard is located at 110th Ave. and Queensburg St. Recycled Materials Company must obtain and hold all necessary permits to operate and maintain the recycle yards. Prior to acceptance of material they will inspect and weigh it in from DIA projects as well as other third parties at their discretion. They will crush and make available various gradations of material as required by DIA at agreed to prices. Excess material may be sold to third parties at market prices. DIA will receive compensation of 5% on all revenues related to third party sales.

e. **Benefits:** In lieu of hauling asphalt and concrete to landfills DIA collects those materials and crushes it into various aggregate sizes to be reused on many projects. This process saves the airport money by not having to haul it to the landfill (many miles away), we receive the material at or below market price and we save money by not having to pay to have it hauled many miles from a different source. This contract will also set up a process that sells excess material to third parties which will generate additional revenue for the airport.
