5. Describe the proposed ordinance, including what the proposed ordinance is intended to accomplish, who's involved

a. Scope of Work

The proposed ordinance is for approval of an intergovernmental agreement (IGA) with UDFCD regarding final design, right-of-way acquisition and construction of drainage and flood control improvements along First Creek at East 56th Avenue in Denver. The purpose of the project is to realign the flood plain to prevent flooding of 56th Avenue during major events, minimize the cost of light rail bridge construction, and maximize developable area for private land owners.

b. Duration

The term of agreement commences upon final execution by all parties and will terminate three years after the final payment is made to the construction contractor. Certain elements of the IGA – Floodplain Regulation, Ownership of Property and Limitation of Use, and Maintenance – run in perpetuity.
