The City has extensively studied the Ouebec Corridor to gather information and needs from the community regarding multi-modal transportation (access, mobility, connectivity, safety, modes - vehicles, transit, pedestrian, and bicycle), drainage, environmental, utilities and much more. The planning studies have involved; The Strategic Transportation Plan of 2008, The East Side Mobility Study of 2010 and the most recently completed planning effort the Quebec Alternatives Analysis (Quebec AA) of 2015.

We are proposing an extensive public involvement process especially in the beginning during the NEPA and conceptual/preliminary engineering design which shall include public affairs to keep our Mayors Office and our City Council Members engaged throughout the process especially at key milestones during the development of the Quebec Street Project. Below is the proposed scope of work for the multidisciplinary planning, environmental and engineering team for Public Involvement and Agency Coordination:

- Throughout the NEPA process, the consultant will coordinate with Denver Public Works to conduct agency coordination and public involvement for the communication and identification of issues and options. A minimum of three (3) public meetings are assumed to be necessary, including initial scoping, review of alternatives, and the presentation and review of the Preferred Alternative and the Environmental Assessment document. Other communication tools and methods are expected to include a project website, small group or neighborhood meetings, agency meetings; development and implementation of a Limited English Proficiency/Environmental Justice/Aging Populations outreach plan and prepare periodic updates on implementation throughout the project; and City Council and CCD Public Works Management briefings. It is anticipated that written and verbal items will be needed in at Spanish, English and potentially other languages depending on the identified populations in the impacted area.
- In addition to the more traditional Public Involvement and Agency Coordination (public meetings, presentation materials, community outreach and updates, website, etc.), the consultant team should demonstrate expertise and experience provided by "Public Affairs" firms. The required activities include, but are not limited to, the following, as appropriate: political strategy and policy development, elected official and outside agency communication, lobbying, formation of partnerships and coalitions, negotiation, problem-solving, and advocacy of a consensus approach.
