What We Know: Child Food Insecurity

Crucial growth and development is occurring during childhood.


Diet quality and food access vary by race, age and neighborhood.



State of Child Food Insecurity in Denver

Federal food assistance programs are not often reaching children who need it most.

Child food insecurity at 16.8% in 2020 (about 1 in 6 kids) [1].

What is HFDK?

- Resident-led ballot measure (302) approved by Denver voters in November of 2018.
- Provides a 10-year funding stream from taxes to invest in Denver's low-income and under-served youth.

HFDK Commission

- 13-members
 - o 3 city leaders
 - 2 members of City Council
 - 4 residents of the city
 - 4 representatives of city-wide organizations or institutions involved in food

DDPHE is the operational support for HFDK and implements Commission decisions.









Who is Eligible for

- Funding?
 •Non-profits, public schools (+DPS) and Denver city agencies through competitive grantmaking processes. Funding can provide programming like:
- Healthy meals and snacks
- Classes on nutrition, cooking, wellness, gardening, and food justice
- Free food distribution, including mobile food markets
- School food pantries



HFDK Timeline

2018	Voters approved ballot measure 302
2019	HFDK Commission seated & meeting, hiring staff, set first funding goals
2020	First RFP released ("HFDK01") and 25 grantees selected, plus COVID-19 emergency hunger relief grants
2021	 Second RFP released ("HFDK02") and 20 new projects approved City Council approves proposed DRMC changes for expanded funding eligibility criteria and greater commission inclusion
2022	 Third RFP released ("HFDK03") focused on early childhood and federal nutrition programs Commission approves 12 HFDK03 new contracts and extensions for HFDK01 and HFDK02 contracts
2023	 Fourth RFP released ("HFDK04") focused on collaboration Commission approves 14 HFDK04 new contracts and extensions for HFDK02 contracts Total awards \$65M for 95 organizations

RFP Process

March-April 2023

21 applications reviewed & scored by 7 reviewers

2 reconciliation meetings

14 applications recommended for funding to HFDK Commission

May 2023

Recommendation &

Vote by Commission

Review panel recommended 14 applications for full/partial funding

May 12, 2023: HFDK Commission voted to approve the 14 contracts

May 2023: Contracting process started



2023 Amended Contract Process

Amended Contracts (HFDK02 cohort)

- HFDK02 contracts are a 1-year term, with up to two additional years of extension.
- March 2023: current grantees submitted a revised scope of work (SOW) and budget.
- March April 2023: Scope of work (SOW) and budgets were reviewed.
 Additionally, grantees were scored on the following criteria:
 - 1) Contract compliance of submission of invoices on time/correct.
 - 2) Contract compliance of submission of Evaluation Data Survey on time.
 - 3) Budget and SOW were reasonable and compliant with contracts.

2023 Amended Contract Process

Amended Contracts (HFDK02)

 April 6, 2023: Renewal Committee met and made a recommendation for HFDK02 renewals.

 April 14, 2023: HFDK Commission approved amendments to the current contracts.



Grantee Cohort Breakdown

New contracts:

- HFDK04 Cohort (08/2023-12/2025)
 - \$20,217,392.25

Contract amendments/extensions:

- HFDK02 Cohort (08/2021-07/2023)
 - \$15,461,736.19*




