WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 373, Series of 2022, established the American Rescue Plan Act Capital Project Fund (38395) in the Grant and Other Money Projects Fund Series, and authorized a cash transfer from the ARPA Operating Grant Fund to the new ARPA Capital Project Fund to support capital investments and improvements at shelters and recreation centers; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 969, Series of 2022, increased the "Recovery" spending allocation to support individuals and families who have experienced food insecurity due to an economic impact by COVID-19 and the effects of inflationary pressures by providing gift cards and vouchers and by expanding culturally relevant food box distribution; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 1450, Series of 2022, allocated a second cash disbursement of \$154 million from Treasury for allocations and programs that were determined through a deliberative process based on input from the community and the Stimulus Investment Advisory Committee (SIAC), allocated cash in the Administration category for program evaluation, and reallocated from premium pay based on expenditures, and authorized capital equipment; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 0548, Series of 2023, allocated amounts in the "Recovery," "Revenue Loss," "Premium Pay," and "Administration" categories in Fund 11011, to support rental assistance programs and The My Spark program; corrected allocations to support the intent of Ordinance 1450, series of 2022; and transferred cash from the ARPA Operating Fund to the ARPA Capital Fund and provided approval to purchase capital equipment; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to amend Ordinance No. 591, Series of 2021, as amended by the subsequent ordinances, to make an additional allocation in the Recovery category based on previously unallocated interest earnings to support the City's 2023 goal to shelter 1,000 individuals;

NOW, THERFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

Section 1. Section 6 of Ordinance No. 591, Series of 2021, as amended by Ordinance 706, Series of 2021, as amended by Ordinance No. 1145, Series of 2021, as amended by Ordinance No. 1192, Series of 2021, and as amended by Ordinance No. 374, Series of 2022, as amended by

Ordinance No. 969, Series of 2022, as amended by Ordinance No. 1450, Series of 2022, as amended by Ordinance No. 10548, Series of 2023, is amended to read as follows:

"That it be and is hereby found and determined that the allocations for the Revenue Loss, Premium Pay, Recovery, and Administration categories, as defined in ARPA guidance, are as follows:

The foregoing reflects \$308,048,870 from the original award plus \$7,857,300 in interest earnings. The foregoing Recovery allocation authorizes a new allocation in the "Recovery" spending category for investments that support the City's 2023 goal to shelter 1,000 individuals. These funds will be used to support expenses for the House 1000 initiative including hotel leasing and operations, purchases and operations for micro communities, and services.

Section 2. The Chief Financial Officer of the City and County of Denver is hereby authorized and directed to make such book and record entries and to do such other things as may be necessary to accomplish the purposes of this Ordinance.
