5. General description or background of proposed request. Attach executive summary if more space needed:

A grant agreement with the State of Colorado for \$948,892.00 for the period of August 23, 2021 through June 30, 2024 for the immunization and vaccination of the COVID-19 virus, for City and County of Denver’s populations disproportionately affected by COVID-19. This project serves to address a health-related issues for populations disproportionately affected by COVID-19, by providing funding to implement strategies for greater equity and access to COVID-19 vaccine. This project consists of promoting and providing COVID-19 immunization services throughout Denver’s populations disproportionately affected by COVID-19 over the next 36 months.

Denver Department of Public Health & Environment will use approximately 60% of the funds to create two DDPHE vaccination teams comprised of a nurse and 2 coordinators to focus on community vaccination events, including those prioritizing BIPOC and PEH populations. The department will incorporate strategies to reach priority population, through partnerships with community leaders, vaccine events at places of worship, work sites, community centers, and community events.

The remaining 40% of the funds will be used to continue Denver Public Health’s In-School Immunization Program (ISIP) through March of 2022. The ISIP project is designed to; improve access to all vaccinations for children and adults; educate the community on the importance of remaining up-to-date on vaccinations and provide information for where to obtain vaccines; and implement strategies to increase access and safe delivery of vaccines such as reminder/recall and outreach vaccination clinics for children and adults.

The funding will aid in developing and implementing programming for bringing vaccine to disproportionately impacted communities through community vaccination events, establishing and managing on-going clinic sites, and providing at-home vaccination for individuals required to stay home for health and safety reasons. This project also includes engaging in existing community outreach activities to collaborate with other partners to improve education and outreach to prioritized communities of focus, including community based organizations and community health centers where applicable. Additionally, this project will provide education and outreach for COVID-19 vaccination to people disproportionately impacted by COVID-19 disease, including racial and ethnic minority groups, and children.
