AMENDATORY AGREEMENT

THIS AMENDATORY AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between the CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER, a municipal corporation of the State of Colorado (the "City"), for and on behalf of the DENVER DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES, "County" and SIGNAL BEHAVIORAL HEALTH NETWORK, with an address of 6130 Greenwood Plaza Boulevard, Suite 150, Greenwood Village, CO 80111 ("Provider" or "Contractor"), with "Trails" Provider Number 27818.

RECITALS

- A. The Parties entered into an Agreement (the "Agreement") under which the Provider provides substance abuse treatment services to child welfare clients under the CORE Services Program administered by the Denver Department of Human Services.
- B. The parties now wish to amend the Agreement to revise the term, provide the scope of work for services previously provided, and increase the maximum amount of compensation to be paid to the Contractor.

Now, therefore, the Parties agree as follows:

- **1.** All references to "...Exhibit A..." in the existing Agreement shall be amended to read: "...Exhibit A-1..." The scope of work marked as Exhibit A-1 is attached and incorporated by reference. Exhibit A-1 will govern and control the services provided from June 1, 2013, until May 31, 2015.
 - **2.** Article 2. of the Agreement is amended to read as follows:
 - **2. TERM OF AGREEMENT**: The term of this Agreement **shall commence on June 1, 2013 and terminate on May 31, 2015** provided that the term may be extended upon mutual agreement of the parties for up to two (2) additional one (1) year periods, subject to the availability of sufficient funds and execution of an Amendatory Agreement.
 - **3.** Article 6.B. of the Agreement is amended to read as follows:

"6. COMPENSATION AND PAYMENT:

B. The Provider shall accept as the sole compensation for services rendered and costs incurred a maximum cost under this Agreement not to exceed **One Million Six Hundred Thirty Five Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty Seven Dollars and Twenty Seven Cents** (\$1,635,757.27) (the "Maximum Contract Amount"). The Provider agrees to accept periodic payment of sums through direct drawdown from funds in appropriate State accounts as full and complete compensation for completion of all the items of work contained in this Agreement, the Exhibits hereto, and a completed SAA, signed and authorized by a DDHS Administrator for each Child covered by this Agreement, in accordance

with the rates stated in Exhibit A-1 attached hereto. The Provider shall be compensated only for types and units of Core Services actually provided to a given Child or family receiving such Core Service as reflected in a completed SAA signed and authorized by a DDHS Administrator."

4. Except as amended above, the Agreement is affirmed and ratified in each particular.

EXHIBIT A-1 SCOPE OF WORK AND BUDGET SIGNAL BEHAVIORAL HEALTH NETWORK CORE SERVICES PROGRAM 2014-16373-01

The Denver County Department of Human Services (DDHS) requires the services of a substance abuse treatment Coordinator to assist the County in delivering substance abuse treatment services to child welfare clients, and **SIGNAL BEHAVIORAL HEALTH NETWORK** (Signal), **TRAILS Provider #27818** is willing and able to provide such services.

Signal is a Colorado non-profit corporation organized for the purpose of managing and coordinating high quality, cost efficient, integrated chemical dependency and related behavioral health care services in the State of Colorado.

THIS PORTION OF THE SCOPE OF WORK REPRESENTS SERVICES PROVIDED BETWEEN THE DATES OF 6/1/2013 THROUGH 5/31/2014.

I. Services

A. Responsibilities of Signal:

- 1. Signal agrees and desires to participate as the service provider coordinator for DDHS qualified child welfare clients under the definition set forth in Colorado State Department of Human Service Regulations Volume VII (7.301.)
- 2. Signal will maintain a high quality of clinical care to clients. The full continuum of care (Outpatient, Intensive Outpatient, Transitional Residential, Intensive Residential, Therapeutic Community, Detoxification or comparable alternatives as mutually agreed upon) will be available to clients. The client's clinical needs will determine the level of care Signal is to provide and Signal will meet those needs regardless of "modality", with the exception of Abstinence Monitoring only. Abstinence Monitoring only services are not covered services under either Core Services or AFS funding.
 - a. Signal and DDHS encourage agencies and clients/consumers/referral agencies to resolve any complaint or grievance or appeal at the level closest to the situation.
 - b. Should DDHS and/or Signal fail to agree upon the level of care offered by Signal, resolution will be negotiated by the Chief Executive Officer of Signal and the Administrator for Substance Abuse Treatment at DDHS. Both, Signal and DDHS will have an opportunity to provide consultation and documentation regarding the case. Signal's Director of Compliance and Quality Improvement may also be consulted. Disputes are to be resolved within 72 working day hours, unless good cause justifies an extension. DDHS reserves the right not to authorize any payment for treatment that DDHS deems inappropriate. Except to the extent services were already provided without written notification of payment denial from DDHS.
 - c. Signal network providers and onsite staff are not authorized to refer adult clients directly to residential services. Any recommendation for adult transitional and/or residential must be approved and authorized by designated DDHS staff. Signal will train DDHS's Program Administrator on data exporting; sorting and analysis of Signal data base information and reports, and DDHS and Signal will review this process at the end of the 3rd quarter and review Signal's ability to add new reporting functions to the Signal website during the next fiscal year.

- d. Signal network providers and onsite staff are not authorized to refer adolescent clients directly to residential or day treatment. Any recommendation for adolescent residential or day treatment must be approved and authorized by designated DDHS staff.
- 3. Signal will provide two (2) full-time ADAD-Approved CAC III substance abuse counselors to DDHS for the purpose of assessment and referral to treatment agencies. These positions will be funded by DDHS Core Services to provide the following services on site at DDHS. Signal will sub-contract with the University of Colorado Health Sciences Center, Addiction, Research and Treatment Services (ARTS) or Denver Health & Hospital Authority or another agreed upon subcontractor for these positions. The primary responsibility these on-site counselors shall be to: conduct evaluations on clients; authorize payment for treatment; consult with caseworkers; be available for substance abuse related emergencies during normal working hours and provide clinical and crisis intervention services regarding substance abuse services. They will also act as a liaison between the provider network and clinicians and DDHS caseworkers for specific case situations and attend case staffing as requested.
- 4. Provide training for caseworkers and clinicians as requested and maintain information and expertise regarding provider services. Signal will assist the subcontract agency providing the onsite services & DDHS in facilitating the hiring and training of new onsite staff.
- 5. Signal will assure that all eligible child welfare clients referred by DDHS in need of treatment outside of the above services provided by Signal on site as listed in #3 above will receive such in accordance with ASAM PPC-IIR level of care and approved by DDHS.
- 6. Signal will serve child welfare clients (parents and children) who comply with the following criteria as DDHS refers:
 - Case is active on Colorado TRAILS System and
 - Case meets the CORE Services Denver Department of Human Services program (CSDDHS) category criteria 4,5, or 6 and
 - Case meets the criteria of "child at imminent risk for out-of-home placement/reunification" set forth by the State of Colorado.
- 7. On site evaluator will complete Signal Evaluations and Referrals
- 8. Signal will assure that the monthly reports and billings are available on Signal's website for DDHS each month. Signal providers have until the 8th calendar day of the month to submit monthly progress reports and the 10th calendar day of the month to submit services. Providers are unable to submit or enter services unless a corresponding monthly progress report is received via the signal system.
- 9. Signal's on-site substance abuse professionals will participate in utilization review and case management as caseload allows, in cooperation with the County including case review, reauthorization for clients requesting multiple treatment admissions.
- 10. Signal will provide summary data/official bill on per client costs and make available all Additional Family Services (AFS) services by the 3rd Wednesday of each month and will be made available on-line before the TRAILS payroll date.

B. Responsibilities of DDHS

- 1. DDHS will provide access to adequate office, meeting space and supplies for the on-site substance abuse counselors at no charge to signal or the provider.
- 2. DDHS will work cooperatively with Signal and the on-site substance abuse counselors to deliver quality, efficient and cost effective medical/substance abuse treatment services to DDHS qualified clients.
- 3. DDHS will make every effort to inform Signal, the employing agency of the on sites and the on-site substance abuse counselors of system issues, developments and complications so that Signal and the clinicians can make informed choices in its role as the managed service organization.
- 4. DDHS will assure that all referrals under this contract meet the eligibility criteria expressed in Section I(A)(6) above.
- 5. DDHS will provide Signal and its applicable providers with updated FSP 5A's within 10 business days of completion upon request.
- 6. DDHS agrees to resist any attempt by the county or juvenile court to name Signal and its providers as Special Respondent in any proceeding.
- 7. DDHS agrees to provide remittance reports. The remittance report will reflect any adjustments made to the Signal billed amounts in sufficient detail to allow the Signal bill plus or minus adjustments to equal the remittance made by EFT to Signal by DDHS. Receipt of such remittance advice/reconciliation shall be received by Signal no later than five-business days after completion of each month's TRAILS payroll unless advance notice of a delay is given by DDHS to Signal.
- 8. DDHS agrees to provide advance written notice to provider and Signal in the event a client becomes ineligible for Core Services or AFS funding or the TRAILS case becomes closed. It is recommended that DDHS shall provide such notice by entering an end date on such client's referral in the Signal system. DDHS shall be responsible for payment for all services rendered under a proper authorization until such time as the end date is entered into the Signal system. However, if there is written record demonstrating that the provider knew the DDHS case was closed (e.g. a monthly progress note stating such) and failed to switch the client over to a new payer source, then DDHS and the Chief Executive Officer of Signal will negotiate a resolution of the dispute.
- 9. Signal enters services and makes available billing by the third Wednesday each month; DDHS shall attempt to enter such services into that month's TRAILS payroll. DDHS will review its payroll system to assess our ability to pay services in a more timely fashion.

II. PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE

Due to different State funding cycles, the period of performance under this agreement will overlap. For the County Core Services, the period of performance shall be for the 12 month period beginning, June 1, 2013 through May 31, 2014 unless sooner terminated or renegotiated. The Signal Additional Family Service period of performance under this

agreement shall be for the 12 month period beginning July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014, unless sooner terminated. As a condition of continuing to render services under this agreement, it is understood that Signal will report any limitation or restriction of their licenseor insurance or the ability to perform the services covered by this agreement under any condition of impairment.

Denver will not be billed nor pay for any billings for Court Testimony from the regular fee for service billings paid through the Trails system.

V. ON-SITE SUBSTANCE ABUSE COUNSELORS – PERSONELL ISSUES

- A. The On-Site counselors will be clinically supervised by their agency of employment (e.g., ARTS). DDHS will incur the associated costs for supervision of the personnel funded through this agreement in accordance with the attached budget. As part of the supervision requirements, the counselors will need to attend staff meetings and supervision meetings off site of the County Department and on site at their agency of employment these meetings will be scheduled at mutually agreed upon times and shall not exceed 10 hours per month. On site staff will be expected to provide both employing agency and DDHS of their work hours, to consist of 40 hours of work per week and of days when they will not be reporting to work. Work hours must be approved by both agencies. Vacations of onsite staff must be coordinated to maintain staff coverage when at all possible.
- **B.** The On-Site counselor will be allowed sick and vacation leave as permitted by the agency of their employment. In addition, due to the safety of the clinician, the agency of employment may consider closing the on-site county office for weather related reasons and with reasonable notice to the counties. The agency of employment is expected to contact the DDHS Closure Line at 720-944-3006 prior to making their decision to allow for weather related reasons absences and if possible, to follow agency hours of operation. These absences from the county on-site office shall be minimized and planned in advance (to the best of one's ability) to accommodate the caseload. In instances of unusual leave issues or leave requirements, the employing agency and Signal are responsible for assisting with coverage for job duties.
- **C.** The on-site counselor shall not be left in the building alone for personal security reasons.

D. Signal and employing agency (e.g., ARTS) will confer with the Administrator for Substance Abuse Treatment to arrange for efficient and timely replacement of coverage for on-site staff in case of resignation of current staff if requested by DDHS.

Up to 111,090.00 shall be dedicated to funding 2.0 full time substance abuse specialists, inclusive of costs related to mileage and supervision of these positions and Signal Administrative costs as reflected in the cost reimbursement budget attached. The remaining funds (\$413,910.00) or up to the total maximum amount of the contract less salary costs paid, shall be billed to DHS under the attached fee for service schedule with a 5% management fee assessed on the monthly invoices.

Signal agrees to contribute \$450,875.00 (Additional Family Services DBH Funding) towards substance abuse treatment services in accordance with the terms of the Budget Sheet during the twelve month period, July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014. This AFS funding will be billed on a fee for service basis. This funding shall be billed to Signal under the attached Fee for Service schedule with a 5% management fee assessed on the monthly invoices.

Receipt of such remittance advice/reconciliation shall be received by Signal no later than 5 business days after completion of each month's TRAILS payroll unless advance notice of a delay is given by DDHS to Signal.
- 8. DDHS agrees to provide advance written notice to provider and Signal in the event a client becomes ineligible for Core Services, or AFS funding, or the TRAILS case becomes closed. It is recommended that DDHS shall provide such notice by entering an end date on such client's referral in the Signal system. DDHS shall be responsible for payment for all services rendered under a proper authorization until such time as the end date is entered into the Signal system. However, if there is a written record demonstrating that the provider knew the DDHS case was closed (e.g. a monthly progress note stating such) and failed to switch the client over to a new payer source, then DDHS and the Chief Executive Office of Signal will negotiate a resolution of the dispute.
- 9. Signal enters services and makes available billing by the 3rd Wednesday of each month; DDHS shall attempt to enter such services into that month's TRAILS payroll. DDHS will review our payroll system to assess our ability to pay services in a more timely fashion.

II. PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE

Due to different State funding cycles, the period of performance under this Agreement will overlap. For the County Core Services, the period of performance shall be for the 12 month period beginning, June 1, 2014 through May 31, 2015, unless sooner terminated or renegotiated. The Signal Additional Family Services period of performance under this Agreement shall be for the 12 month period beginning July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015, unless sooner terminated. As a condition of continuing to render services under this Agreement, it is understood that Signal will report any limitation or restriction of their license, or insurance, or the ability to perform the services covered by this Agreement under any condition of impairment.

IV. COURT TESTIMONY

Billings from agencies or individuals in response to Denver City Attorney subpoenas and/or testimony in Denver Juvenile Court cases fall outside the scope of this contract and must be negotiated with the Denver City Attorney's Office. Such billings may be routed to:

Denver will not be billed nor pay for billings for Court Testimony from the regular fee for service billings paid through the TRAILS system.

V. ONSITE SUBSTANCE ABUSE COUNSELOR - PERSONNEL ISSUES

- A. The onsite counselor will be clinically supervised by their agency of employment (e.g. ARTS). DDHS will incur the associated costs for supervision of the personnel funded through this agreement in accordance with the attached budget. As part of the supervision requirements the counselor will need to attend staff meetings and supervision meetings off site of the County Department and onsite at their agency of employment. These meetings will be scheduled at mutually agreed upon times and shall not exceed 10 hours per month. Onsite staff will be expected to provide both employing agency and DDHS of their work hours, to consist of 40 hours of work per week and of days when they will not be reporting to work. Work hours must be approved by both agencies. Vacations of onsite staff must be coordinated to maintain staff coverage when at all possible.
- **B.** The On-site counselor will be allowed sick and vacation leave as permitted by the agency of their employment. In addition, due to the safety of the clinician, the agency of employment may consider closing the on-site county office for weather related reasons and with reasonable notice to the Counties. The agency of employment is expected to contact the DDHS Closure Line at 720-944-3006 prior to making their decision to allow for weather related absences and if possible, to follow agency hours of operation. These absences from the County on-site office shall be minimized and planned in advance (to the best of one's ability) to accommodate the caseload. In instances of unusual leave issues or leave requirements, the employing agency and Signal are responsible for assisting with coverage for job duties.
- **C.** The On-site Counselor shall not be left in the building alone for personal security reasons.
- **D.** Signal and employing agency (e.g., ARTS) will confer with the Administrator for Core Services to arrange for efficient and timely replacement of coverage for onsite staff in case of resignation of current staff if requested by DDHS.

Up to \$66,473.40 shall be dedicated to funding 1.0 full-time substance abuse specialist, inclusive of costs related to mileage and supervision of these positions, and Signal Administrative costs as reflected in the cost reimbursement budget attached. The remaining funds (\$625,600.27) or up to the total maximum amount of the contract less salary costs paid, shall be billed to DDHS under the attached fee-for-service schedule with a 5% management fee assessed on the monthly invoices.

Signal agrees to contribute \$455,363.43 (Additional Family Services OBH Funding) towards substance abuse treatment services in accordance with the terms of the Budget Sheet during the twelve month period, July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015. This AFS funding will be billed on a fee-for-service basis. This funding shall be billed to Signal under the attached Fee-For-Service schedule with a 5% management fee assessed on the monthly invoices.
