The ordinance represents the City's approval for the expenditures necessary to execute the responsibilities of the district as well as the imposition of a special assessment necessary to generate sufficient revenue to pay the district's expenses.

- c. Location: The district is located in west Denver. The boundaries of the district include all commercial property abutting both sides of West Colfax from Federal to Sheridan Boulevard.

Benefits: Business Improvement Districts (BID's) are organized for the benefit of commercial properties to assist with infrastructure improvements and their maintenance, as well as having the ability to perform marketing and economic development activities. This district was created to provide a mechanism to strengthen the business environment of the West Colfax corridor. Economic development services include: New existing business support, business attraction and retention, consumer marketing, special events, maintenance and trash receptacles. Safety programs include video monitoring, enhanced patrols and community and business watch programs.
- f. Costs: Districts are self funded with no direct costs to the City. The district has no debt and no mill levy but assesses commercial property owners with a special assessment. The 2014 budget contemplates leaving the special assessment unchanged from 2013. The proposed assessed budgetary expenditures for 2014 are **\$363,940.50**.

Safety Programs include video monitoring, enhanced patrols and community and business watch programs.
