Scope of work:

The overall goal of CTPI-E is to increase tree canopy in low tree equity, heat vulnerable neighborhoods. Outcomes are broken out by partner:

AFC+A CREA aims to greatly increase outreach and planting in four existing CTPI neighborhoods and expand to other low-canopy, high equity-need neighborhoods. AFC+A CREA aims to plant approximately 300 each year for five years (1,500 total trees) engage 2,000 residents in Denver and employ community members from low-canopy communities as Promotores Verdes.

- TPP aims to greatly increase outreach and planting in four existing CTPI neighborhoods and expand to other low canopy, high equity-need neighborhoods. TPP aims to plant approximately 315 trees each year for five years (1,575 trees total trees); hire four community connectors from low-canopy communities; and train 150 *TreeForce* participants, improving economic outcomes for them and their families (500+people). Additionally, the arborist will advise on tree health and maintenance for 1,500 trees a year, train 150 Community Foresters (volunteer tree enthusiasts), and support community-led greening efforts of 150-200 grassroots partners, including neighborhood registered associations, nonprofits, and other localized entities.
- Through **FNE**, **OCF** aims to serve 250 households per year. It is estimated over five years it could offer more than \$1.3M in forestry services to the community. For Sun Valley, **FNE** aims to plant an
